From the Desk of Father Theisen



Padre's Pen - The Offertory of Holy Mass

In my wanderings around our church at St. Wenceslaus I have noticed that very few people sign up to bring the gifts of bread and wine

forward at Mass. I also get feedback from our ushers that it is difficult to find people willing to present the gifts at Mass. So, let's look at this important part of the Mass and see what is really happening.

Since the very early days of the Church, the gifts of bread and wine were either made or acquired by members of the congregation and brought to the Church for sacred use. The author Nikolaus Gihr in his book "Holy Sacrifice of the Mass" explains it this way, "The bread and wine are withdrawn from common use, consecrated to God and previously sanctified, that they may be in a manner prepared and made fit for their unspeakably exalted destiny. We give up all claims to these earthly gifts and offer them to the Most High, with the intention and desire that He would change them in the course of the

sacrifice into the most holy Body and Blood of Christ." The Presentation of the Gifts is both a sign and the reality of the faith we have in the action of that Church Christ founded to extend His presence through history in the most precious Blessed Sacrament.

Even more than the "giving up of earthly goods" the Presentation of the Gifts is the giving up of our hearts to the Lord (our hearts being the symbol of all our joys, sorrows, desires, prayers...our very lives). Thus, in the Preface Dialog after the Offertory the priest will say, "Lift up your hearts," and the people respond, "We lift them up to the Lord!"

Whether you sign up or are asked to bring the gifts forward, you are being asked a couple of things 1) Are you willing to overcome your personal reluctance to step forward in faith and give all to Christ in a public way? 2) Are you willing to be a representative of the whole people of God and place all their joys, sorrows, prayers, and lives (along with yours) on the Altar of Christ's Sacrifice?

Most of us wouldn't have any issue with getting up from anywhere in church and walking out if there was an urgent need to use the facilities or if we were feeling a bit faint. We should all have the same attitude of urgency to place our prayers and our lives on the altar with the gifts of bread and wine! I have hopeful expectation that our signup sheet in the back of church will fill up, and that if our ushers on occasion must ask someone to assist in this important ministry, they will never get "No" for an answer unless there is some physical disability that prevents them.

Finally, given the importance of this liturgical action, I'm wondering what our good parishioners at St. John and St. Scholastica think? Should we re-institute the Gift Procession as it was before COVID? And are they willing to volunteer on a regular basis to bring the gifts forward?
