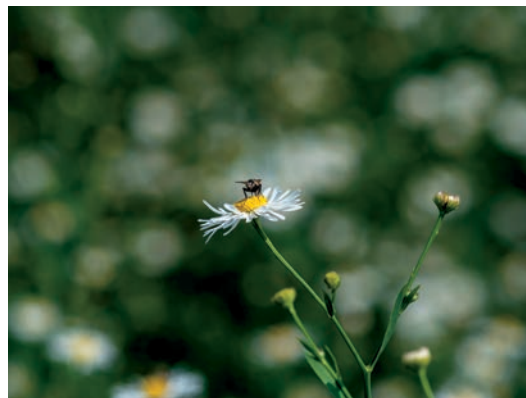
- Adopt-a-Garden: Choose one location to work in. Extra help is available.

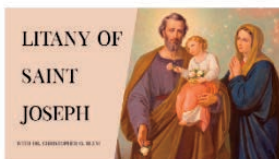
