

Padre's Pen – Reason and Emotion in the Life of Faith.

Our gospel reading this weekend (except the one Mass at St. Wenceslaus where we use the Second Scrutiny for Isabelle, our catechumen, who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil. At that 8:30 am Mass, we will be using the Cycle A reading of the man born blind) which gives us the person of Nicodemus who originally came to Jesus at night, in the darkness. Jesus's exhortation to Nicodemus speaks of coming to the light and repudiating the darkness. Jesus Christ is of course the light and coming to Him is the answer, but how do we come to Him?

We differ from the beasts of the earth in our creation in the image and likeness of God and in our ability to reason; we are not guided by our baser instincts/emotions but rather assert our will/reason to guide our emotions. Animals do not sin in their actions because they have no reasoning ability to understand the implications of their actions. Human beings do have that reasoning ability and can therefore sin. As my mother used to say to me, "You should know better!"

Jesus says the same thing throughout His ministry. He tells everyone to "Repent," using the Greek word *metanoia*, which means to have a "Change of Mind." That is, we are called by Christ to engage our reasoning abilities to come to Him who is the light. So, we might say that we use the "Light of Reason" which is the gift of God to humanity so we can rise above the creaturely nature of our humanity and tap into the divine image within us.

Reason and emotion have an exchange and interplay that must take place for us to fully live our lives in the image and likeness of God. Reason guides our emotions while emotions inform our reason. For example, our emotions may rise up and say, "I am so angry with this person/situation," but reason steps in and says, "Take a deep breath, relax, what is the real issue that needs to be addressed?" Emotion without reason is beastly. Reason without emotion is sterile. That leads us to the all-important question, "Is it reasonable to believe that God's love for me personally is so great that He would die for me?' And if the answer is "Yes," then what am I going to do about it?

I pray your Lent is going well and look forward to celebrating the Paschal Mysteries with you in Holy Week.

Blessed Karl's Corner -

Lieutenant-Colonel Strutt arrived just in time for the royal family. By March 16, 1919, an election was held in Vienna, and Karl Renner ended up as chancellor. The very next day, Renner's government sent a telegram to Strutt, informing him that it would be "highly advisable to get the Emperor out of Austria and into Switzerland at once...the British Government can in no way guarantee your journey." Strutt kept the telegram to himself and went to Vienna to get a lay of the land. He found that things were not favorable for Karl and his family and decided to start organizing for the family's safe departure.

March is the Month of Saint Joseph.

The month of March is dedicated to Saint Joseph, the husband of Mary and foster father of Jesus. Saint Joseph is more commonly known as the patron of fathers, families, and workers, as he so faithfully cared for Mary and Jesus. 
SCHOOL NEWS

School Closed Monday, March 11.


All programs are closed next week, including Club House. Our staff will be off-site for a day of retreat, reflection, and prayer.




So excited to be offering VBS this summer!
