

From Fr. Sean Smith

Dear Friends in Christ,

Buongiorno! After 14 days in Italy, it is wonderful to be back home! The trip was fantastic, and I look forward to sharing more of it with you in the near future. We visited Rome (you can see me at St. Peter's Square with the Basilia behind me), Montecassino (the location of St. Benedict's Abbey), San Giovanni Rotundo (where St. Padre Pio lived his life), Monte Sant' Angelo (site of apparitions of St. Michael the Archangel), Lanciano (site of the first Eucharistic Miracle), Loreto (site of the Holy House), Assisi (St. Francis, St. Clare, Bl. [soon to be St.] Carlo Acutis), and Orvieto (site of a stunning church, Duomo di Orvieto, and a beautiful winery). I prayed Masses and rosaries for your intentions while I was there!



I want to thank the staff at St. Patrick and the NLCC for doing such a great job while I was away! It was a great relief to know that everything would run so smoothly! I also want to thank Fr. Martin and Fr. Vu for providing the weekend Masses. And I also want to thank all of you that responded so generously to the Unbound appeal. I think we provided 15 sponsorships. I haven't visited my parents in over 18 months, so I'm flying to North Carolina early Monday morning to spend a few days with her as she convalesces. 
