From Fr. Sean Smith

Dear Friends in Christ.

It has been over six weeks since Archbishop Zinkula announced the *Journey in Faith* initiative in the Archdiocese. There is a lot going on, and you probably have some questions. Many of your initial questions can probably be answered on the <u>dbqjourneyinfaith.org</u> website. Here's an update:

Each parish in the Archdiocese has put together a team of people to represent the parishes in the planning process. These team members "members will serve as the primary ambassadors of the *Journey in Faith* planning initiative to their fellow parishioners as well as the primary ambassadors of the parish to the Archdiocese of Dubuque" (*Journey in Faith* Parish Team Role Descriptions document). These team members are participating in four-hour training sessions during the month of August in their respective Regional Planning Areas (RPAs), e.g., Anamosa is in the Cedar Rapids RPA, and the parishes of the NLCC are in the Dyersville RPA. These meetings are providing greater insight into the planning process, proposed models, and how this information will be shared with the wider Archdiocesan community beginning in September.

I want to encourage everyone to take two concrete actions. First, pray for the success of this *Journey in Faith* initiative using the *JiF* Prayer that has been shared previously (we also have prayer cards for you to take home with you). Second, check out the dbgjourneyinfaith.org website! Specifically, under the Resources tab there is a FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions) page and also a Glossary of Terms. In the coming weeks, I'm going to share some information from the website with you. The rest of this bulletin article is copied directly from the FAQ section of the website:

What are the goals of the pastoral planning process?

- Renew discipleship by forming joyful missionary disciples
- Strengthen parish vibrancy through collaboration and sustainability
- Support our priests in health, holiness, and mission
- Create a sustainable organization of parishes into pastorate groupings

What are the primary considerations when creating vibrant and sustainable pastorates for the next 25+ years?

- Evangelization
 - Celebrate inspiring liturgies and sacraments in full churches
 - Engage parishioners in rich and meaningful formation
 Foster disciples who serve and are sent on mission

 - Amplify clergy strengths through viable pastoral assignments
- Pastoral Planning






Monthly Newsletter

The Eucharistic miracle of O'Cebreiro – During the Mass the Host changed to Flesh and the wine changed to Blood and was expelled from the chalice, staining the corporal. The Lord performed this prodigy in order to sustain the little faith of the priest who did not believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. To this day, the Sacred Relics of the miracle are guarded near the church where this prodigy took place and numerous pilgrims go there annually to honor them.
