From Fr. Sean Smith

Dear Friends in Christ,

This bulletin covers two weeks, from the Fourth Sunday of Advent, through Christmas, and to the Feast of the Holy Family, and I was told I get a whole page to fill! So lots of things!



First, Happy/Merry/Blessed to all of the celebrations in these weeks! We are still preparing our hearts and minds for the coming of Christ, then celebrating his coming as an infant 2,000 years ago, and then rejoicing in the family of Jesus and Mary and Joseph! I hope that these days will be filled with joy and light and peace, and quality time with family and friends! Just as the Holy Family was on the move, so too are we!

I visited with some dear friends recently, and we talked about vocations to priesthood and religious life in the Church. My friend was insistent that the first and most important thing we need to do is pray for vocations! She asked if we had a petition at Mass where we kept vocations in front of everyone. I didn't really push back on the idea, but I kept asking, "what else, what is next?" Ever since that conversation I've felt sort of convicted about the point about prayer. I can't think of a single reason why we should not be asking the Lord of the Harvest to send out workers into his harvest, so we're going to be including that in our prayers at all our Masses.

But, we need to be honest about the situation with vocations. Do we think that God is no longer calling men to be priests, or women and men to be consecrated religious (Sisters and Brothers in religious orders)? I don't for a second believe that God is the bottleneck when it comes to vocations! I think God is calling men and women into the life of service all the time! The hearts and minds that need to be opened in generosity are ours, not God's!

What are some of the fundamental challenges when it comes to religious vocations? There are many:

- A general decrease in religiosity in our nation
- Families having fewer and fewer children
- With fewer and fewer children, families are not as open to promoting vocations within their own families. It's easier to consider a vocation in your family when you have seven children than if you have one child
- The decreasing participation in the life of the Church, i.e., Mass attendance, Confession and other sacraments, faith formation
- A lack of prayer and discernment regarding vocations, and an unwillingness to say anything to others
- Priests need to be intentional about cultivating relationships that lead to vocations
- Effects of the sex abuse scandal

So what can we do? First, as my friend suggested, PRAY! Be intentional about praying for vocations to the priesthood and religious life! Make a holy hour to pray for vocations, fast for vocations. Next, look for young men and women that may have a vocation; speak to them, encourage them, invite them to consider a vocation! Let them know you are praying for them by name! Maybe in your own prayer life, focus on vocations in this coming year in a very specific way.

While there isn't as much "public" activity today, there is a lot of work being done on the *Journey in Faith* initiative. There were thousands of items of feedback and the Archbishop and his team are working hard to process all that information and discern the path forward. I invite you to be intentional about praying for the Archbishop and for the Archdiocese as a whole. Pray with an open heart and mind that God's will be done, and that we be able to respond with grace and charity.

You are probably familiar with the idea of Mass Intentions, where people request that a Mass be offered for a specific intention, most often (but not only) for deceased loved ones. This is an act of charity where we pray for our beloved dead. We received a notification from Archbishop Zinkula that the bishops of the Province of Iowa have decided that for the first time in over 50 years, the offering/stipend for the intention is being raised from \$5 to \$10, effective January 1, 2026. However, all offerings/stipends already given and accepted at the current designated amount of the Province at \$5 are obligated to be fulfilled at that amount. It is important to note that a lack of financial resources will not exclude anyone desiring a Mass to be offered for a specific intention! Simply request the Mass and I will fulfill that intention. And one final point on Mass Intentions—given the unknowns regarding Mass schedules beginning in July 2026, we are not at this time accepting any intentions past the end of June 2026.

Finally, I just want to acknowledge all the people that are already doing so much to make our parishes joy-filled places where people can encounter Jesus Christ! May your lives be filled with the light and love of our Savior!






