

PASTOR'S PAGE

GOD'S TIMING . . . AS USUAL, ALWAYS CORRECT



I have found something very interesting as I get older – our Lord God always seems to get it right when it comes to the timing of events in a person's life. I'm talking about *when* things come to pass in a person's life. We often tend to think that God's timing is all wrong – He should do things *now* that He doesn't seem to be doing, or that He should *not* be doing things now, but hold them off 'til later – but we usually come to the conclusion much later (maybe years or decades) that in fact His timing – as always – was impeccable. It would not have been as good if whatever happened had happened at some time other than when it did.

Some examples from my own experience: Priests are obliged by the Church to make an annual retreat, and so I do. But there is a special kind of retreat, usually a once-in-a-lifetime retreat, that goes for 30 days . . . Not many people do a 30-day retreat, but I had the chance to do one 18 years after I had been ordained. I did my 30-day retreat in 2008 – and I was so glad it hadn't happened before that time. Some priests do those retreats while they are still in the seminary or within a few years of ordination – but that would not have been good for me. I needed all 18 of those years of priestly ministry to ready myself for that experience. I know that very plainly. I am very grateful the Lord God had me wait for the right time as He willed it for me.

Another: In theory, a priest has a chance to go on a sabbatical every seven years. Almost none do, for various reasons. Most priests, if they do a sabbatical at all, will do one and only one during their entire priestly ministry. My first (and only thus far – and probably will be) sabbatical was in the fall of 2009, right before I came to Sts. Anne & Joachim as pastor. I had been a priest *19 years* at that point. I did my sabbatical at the North American College in Rome, and I am so glad I had not taken a sabbatical before nineteen years of ministry had passed. The sabbatical – and the experience of Rome itself – would not have been nearly as fruitful if I had done it earlier in my priesthood. I'm sure of that.

One more: Years ago I read *The Inferno*, the first part of *The Divine Comedy* by Dante. In *The Divine Comedy* Dante relates a journey he undertook through Hell, Purgatory, and Heaven (need I say this is fiction?). *The Inferno* – his journey through the stages of Hell, is probably the most well-known of the three parts, but after my first reading of *The Inferno* I set the book aside for many years – perhaps over 20 or more. In 2019 I decided to read *The Inferno* again, and again set the book aside. Then last year, in 2020, I was inspired to pick *The Divine Comedy* up and read *The Purgatorio* – and it was *excellent*. That was enough for 2020. Now this year – 2021 – I decided to finally finish it off with *The Paradiso* – and wow! – it is fabulous!

But the beauty of my whole experience with *The Divine Comedy* is this: the fact that I didn't get around to *The Paradiso* until age 58 and 31 years as a priest was *perfect*! I truly believe it would not have been as affecting to me until I had reached this point in my life's time. Now I am glad I did not read it earlier, as I probably would not have been as moved by it, would have judged it to be rather pedestrian, and never have gone back to it. I would have missed out on its full import.

Now – to get back to the point I started this with: *the Lord God's TIMING is always right on*. He knows not only *what* He's doing, He knows *when* to do it. And my overall impression is that many of the best things are put off for us by Him until we are older . . . wiser . . . more mature . . . more spiritually adept . . . however, you want to see it. Don't be surprised that if you haven't already come to see this that someday you will. And *enjoy* – even in tough circumstances – getting older. The longer we live - no mater what the length of that life might ultimately be - will inevitably lead to graces the likes of which we could not even know enough to ask for.

The Paradiso, understood in its fullness, makes one look forward to the next life. But I wouldn't have been able to understand it in its fullness before this time in my life. And of course, *The Paradiso* is only an epic poem written by a human being that never actually has been there to see/experience it. But it's one of the best foretastes I've known of what's to come for those who love God. And it's going to be better than anything Dante could have imagined. And I know that now – at age 58 – in a way I would never have been able to, or perhaps not even been as interested in, at age 28. God's timing in my life has always been spot on. Yours too, surely.





Safe Haven Sunday 2021

Second Sunday in Lent

Can any parent here imagine being asked to sacrifice one of your children? All parents must shudder when they hear the story in our first Scripture reading today from the book of Genesis where God asks Abraham to sacrifice his only son, Isaac. Of course, Isaac is spared in the end. But the visceral reaction of the parents who hear this story might linger as they imagine losing their child especially through their own actions.

Yet, there is a stark reality that many of our children are being sacrificed without parents even knowing. I am referring to the pornography industry which is intent on snaring our children in a highly charged and potentially addictive habit.

It is startling to learn that the average age of first exposure to pornography is 11 years old. Most children are exposed either by accident or through a friend. And once exposed, they begin to seek it out. Studies have shown that of the top 10 websites in the country, 3 of those top 10 are porn sites, which account for almost as much activity as Google.

This highly profitable industry completely distorts the purpose of sexuality. It increases the view that sex is just an enjoyable way of connecting with another person. As a result, it decreases the view of sexuality that we understand through our faith, namely, that sex is meant to be an expression of unity between husband and wife as well as a means of creating new life in children.

Exposure to pornography has a negative effect on children, leading to a sense of shame and agitation. Their shame leads them to disconnect from parents and from a sense of a loving God. This disconnection and its relationship to pornography is often undiscovered and may even continue into adulthood.

Because of the serious impact that pornography can have both emotionally and spiritually on individuals and families, our Diocese has designated this Sunday as "Safe Haven Sunday" to empower parents to make their homes a "safe haven" from the effects of pornography.

It is easy to see how this evil in our society is a powerful tool of the Devil that is meant to draw us away from God and alienate us from one another. However, we are not alone in dealing with this threat. As St. Paul reminds us today in the reading from his letter to the Romans, "If God is for us, who can be against us?" By His death and resurrection, Jesus overcame the power of the Devil and He will share that power with us since, as St. Paul reminds us, He "is at the right hand of God and intercedes for us."

In today's Gospel, Jesus is transfigured before his disciples to show his glory and help sustain them as they must witness his suffering and death. The Transfiguration reminds us that we can overcome life's most serious difficulties, but we must first endure the cross, with God's help. As a Diocese, we pray for all our parents that they may rely on the strength of Christ to address the issue of pornography with their children and make their home a "Safe Haven."
