



PASTOR'S PAGE



SOMETIMES SOME BAD ... CAN BE GOOD ...

I'm writing this up on Tuesday evening – do you remember Tuesday? It was the *beautiful* day this past week – a *gorgeous* day – a *spring-has-arrived* day – although I'm very much aware that we're not done with winter yet. And I'm not sure what the rest of the week has in store – perhaps we'll get another day like this. But this day – Tuesday – was a gem. Made you want to get out of Dodge and . . . go to Utah . . .

However – if you put this very same day in another part of the country – for example, in southern Arizona – or in southern Utah – many of the folks there would shiver and complain. "It only got in the 50's!" they would moan. "I had to wear a jacket!" And so on . . . Why this difference?

It's got to be that we in the northland have once again come to the end – or near the end – of another long winter, and we love a sunny day in the 50's!! It's like the whole world is new! Spring! Resurrection! Smiles all around! It's the darn winter we just endured – it's because of the winter we had to deal with that this day was so SPECTACULAR! Do you see the reason for my title above? Sometimes some bad (in this case, our winters in NoDak) can be good (oh my gosh it is gorgeous out today!).

In a fallen world we have to use all the advantages we can. And one of our best advantages is that even though many things are tough and uncomfortable and can even induce tears, those very same things can often lead to even more joy, more smiles, and an interior hope and optimism that would not otherwise have been. It's almost worth the heartache and the hassles of the sufferings and hardships in life to experience the unbelievable turnaround we get when things get better. I have to say the following while gritting my teeth just a bit: it's worth going through our winters in order for us to treasure and wonder and breathe in the beauty of a beautiful spring day.

And that explains why our God allows some of those heartaches and hassles and sufferings and hardships in our lives: after persevering and grinding through those tough times, His grace and His victory and His sharing His life in and with us *becomes even more glorious!* One day . . . someday . . . when we (God willing) are safely in eternal life with Him, we will look back with a sense of gratefulness for the hardships and crosses we carried with and for Him in this life, because we see how they were used to bring us to the joy we will have forever with Him.

We can already see how these darn winters have given us an appreciation for sun and warmth and spring that people in other parts of the country do not have. Of course they do not have to put up with winter, either. What would you choose if you could? My first inclination would of course be that I would sacrifice the realization of the beauty of spring to escape the doldrums of winter . . . but I wonder. To NOT have the "spring" experience the way we can get it in North Dakota like we had today after a long winter might just be a bigger loss than I think it would be.

But in any event, as long as we're here – let's *enjoy* the spring that's coming. And, as long as we're here in a fallen world, let's *enjoy* what the Lord God will give us after having carried our many crosses for Him and with Him in the life He gives us.

Additional Note from Pastor

Dear parishioners of Sts. Anne & Joachim,

Earlier this week, Bishop Folda announced the following update to the Covid-19 diocesan guidelines: "While social distancing is to be maintained by individuals and clusters, pews need not be blocked off." In other words, the ropes are coming off and all the pews will now be available in the church for use during Mass.

I believe the timing is right. On the one hand, we simply need the extra room. More people are coming back to Mass – good! – and in such numbers that it is becoming increasingly harder to accommodate them adequately. At some Masses we have almost as many out in the gathering space – some standing – as we do in the church proper.

On the other hand, in these ten months since last May when Masses resumed we have learned quite well how to socially distance prudently and charitably. I have been very happy to see how our parish has adapted to these circumstances. And now the Bishop is allowing us to make the next step, while still asking for reasonable social distancing. Please be conscious of the others around you and how your presence might be affecting them. Appreciate our opportunity to make this move and let's do it right.


A few notes:

- Please know that the dispensation of the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation remains; Bishop Folda has not changed that.
- The 12:30 p.m. Mass on Sunday will remain a "mask-only" Mass, for those who still need that reassurance in coming to worship. Anyone is allowed to attend that Mass who wishes, but ALL who attend will be required to wear a mask once they enter the church and for the duration of the Mass.
- As the obligation to attend weekend Masses is still dispensed, you may consider attending a weekday Mass to give yourself the opportunity to worship Our Lord each week and receive the Eucharist, while being able to avoid the larger crowd of the weekend Masses but keep in mind the 7:45 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Masses on Sunday still have considerable room for more people to attend.






