Pastor's Page

EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL



The glory of glories of the gifts that God has given to us is the Eucharist - the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, the Son of the Father. Every Communion is a communion with God Himself - in a way that not even Abraham, or Moses, or David were able to have. We are incredibly blessed with availability to the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in our lives - both in our very bodies as a result of Communion, and in our church's tabernacles where the Eucharist resides 24/7 for the sake of Viaticum, Communion for the homebound and the sick, and Adoration as we worship before Him truly present.

And yet . . . as with everything in this world of time, we can begin to take even the Eucharist for granted. As time passes, if we are not careful with our faith, we can begin to slowly but surely and subtly lose not only our faith in His Real Presence, but our desire for Him there, our taste for Him in it . . . and finally it becomes possible to simply pass the gift by and take no notice.

When this kind of protracted negligence gets directed to our spouses, our children, our loved ones, or the things we are responsible for, it is not only a sad state of affairs, it can lead to a lot of heartache, injustice, and sin. When this happens to us in terms of the Eucharist, it has become a tragedy.

Granted, the Eucharist demands the gift of faith for It to be recognized for what It is. But every Catholic has access to the gift of faith - our Father would not deny that to anyone. If we lack that gift of faith it is on us. And it leads to a coldness and indifference to the things of God, including God Himself - Jesus Christ, really present in the Eucharist.

None of this is new to our modern age. Followers of Christ have lost their faith and turned away from the sacraments and Our Lord from day one. But there is no doubt that this lack of Eucharistic faith is growing in our own time, and more and more Catholics, although they would probably never have deliberately and consciously turned away from God, have allowed themselves with little baby steps over a period of time to turn away from Him nonetheless.

The bishops in America are going to be putting forward a new initiative in the Church they have named a "Eucharistic Revival." It's time to reclaim some of the basics of our faith life - and the most basic - and the most important - is the understanding of the very presence of God in our life and in our world, and the understanding and devotion to the Presence of Jesus Christ, His Son, in the Holy Eucharist. In the months and year to come you will undoubtedly be hearing more about this from our Church.

Quite providentially, one of our parishioners a few months ago came to me with a donation - he had procured a number of informational boards concerning "Miracles of the Eucharist" as they have happened in the past around the world. Of course the Eucharist itself is the greatest of all miracles in our midst, but the Lord God has granted miracles within that miracle - "Eucharistic Miracles" they are called. These are historical happenings concerning the Eucharist in times past and in all corners of the globe as the Lord has given us occasion to reignite our waning faith in His Real Presence. This parishioner has donated these boards to our parish to be put out publicly in our gathering space a few at a time, and so we will begin to do that. There will be three of them beginning this weekend for a few weeks, and then perhaps a break, and then a few more will go out in the weeks and months to come. Take a look. Take a read. Read them slowly - let it sink in. Don't just pass them by. Then enter the church for Mass ready to worship and receive the Eucharist if you were coming to Mass, or head back home after Mass with a greater understanding and love for what you received at Holy Communion. I do hope you find them as inspirational as I do.

This past week we found a trove of DVD's on the occasion of the dedication of our (new) church back on February 11, 2010, with Bishop Aquila. We had made a lot of them and given out a lot of them, and now we discovered a whole bunch more that we still have that we never knew about. We have copies in our parish archives, and we don't need to keep all these extras . . but if anyone would like a copy, please call our office and we will get one to you. What a beautiful evening that was now 12 years ago, and as you watch it you will notice how "unfinished" our church was in some ways when we opened it. We didn't have our crucifix at that time yet, nor our tabernacle, nor the big statues of Mary and Jesus - even some of the colors in the church were different back then and we have since re-painted! But the primary focus, however, was the dedication and the consecration of our new church and altar by our bishop at that time. It was the first Mass in our church, as we have been moving forward ever since that day. If you would like a copy of that Mass of Dedication on DVD, let us know.



The Church asks that each parish have a Pastoral Council made up of the lay faithful, over which the pastor presides, who can offer advice and assistance in fostering pastoral activity in the parish. It is a consultative voice for the pastor concerning any issues he brings to them from the parish, or any issues that they bring to the pastor from the people in the parish, or from their own experience of living and serving in the parish.

council is a fine way to serve your parish and your brothers and sisters in the parish family. The time commitment for the Council includes five meetings per year, as well as some of

the parish activities that take place each year, including the Parish Feast Day Picnic and the Fall Festival. The term for a Council member is three years, and there is no second term for any member until at least a year has intervened since their last time on the Council. This ensures that the Council always has "new blood" and is reflective of the parish at that time as it changes and grows itself.

Please consider whether you, or someone you know, might be a good person for this role. **Nominations will be taken after Masses on the weekend of February 19-20, with elections to be held two weeks later.** Three positions need to be filled this year; there are a total of nine members on our Pastoral Council.

In these upcoming days/weeks, you are encouraged to pray and ask our Lord God if He is calling you – or someone you know – to serve our parish by being a member of the Pastoral Council. Thank you for considering this opportunity to serve God and your parish!
