Pastor's Page

THE DESERT



I truly enjoy the desert Southwest. This past March I was once again there, in the desert lands of southern New Mexico, and had plenty of time to think and ponder as I was hiking the trails. A thought came to me that I decided to write down and share with all of you when I got the chance - here's my chance.

The desert can be seen as the "result" of many factors, but there is one factor in particular that rises above the others: it is dry. It is the aridity of the desert that makes it a desert. Oh - there's water out there - but usually it's hidden and is in relatively short supply. And it's that very shortage of moisture that brings about two interesting characteristics of desert life.



One result of the desert's aridity is the generous space between plants. If and when you hike in the desert, you'll notice that it is very different from a jungle - the plants are spaced apart quite nicely, unlike the jungle where they are overlapping and intertwining with each other to the point where it's even hard to hike through the jungle. The reason for that spacing in the desert is that there is only so much water available and nature seems to know instinctively that it can only support so many plants. They are naturally spaced apart so that each get the moisture it needs to survive from the little that's available. (In the jungle, the abundance of moisture produces a riot of plant life.)

Another characteristic of the desert is that pretty much every plant that lives there has spines or barbs or something that will hurt/sting/draw blood if one gets into contact with it without being careful. Life is so precious in the desert with its various struggles that nature protects itself from anything outside itself that may come into contact with it, either intentionally or not.

And so I was pondering the way nature is different in the desert to the way you see it in . . . say . . . North Dakota. And, of course, I began to ponder it in terms of the ways of God and the spiritual life - and why not? - perhaps I would get a homily or a Pastor's Page out of it? (And I did.)

Jesus Christ often likened the Holy Spirit to "rivers of living water" and other water-filled images. And indeed, the Spirit of God is like unto water that keeps us literally alive in our life of grace as children of God. Without water, we die - and so the desert can be deadly if one is not prepared when they enter it. Without the Holy Spirit, we die in our soul - and so one must avoid those "occasions of sin" that will, if fallen into, deprive us of the life of grace and of God.

But let's ponder a person that in fact does cut themselves off from the waters of the Spirit. What happens to them? The same thing that happens in the desert.

First, without the moisture of the Spirit in us we begin to space ourselves apart from each other. Without the Spirit of God within, we become selfish/self-centered and draw away from others to lives for ourselves. It's the Spirit of God that draws us together in love in the one family of God; it's the lack of the Spirit of God that draws us apart from each other to live, ultimately, a lonely and depressed life, separated from others and often without any friends nearby.

Second, without the moisture of the Spirit in us we feel the need for much self-protection. We're living for ourselves then and we know that our safety and security rely on ourselves alone. And so we develop all kinds of barbs and spines in our life to protect ourselves from any real (or usually imagined) enemies - either within as negative personality traits that "draw blood" from others when they come into contact with us, or without as living the kind of life that hurts other people by our actions and words that reach them. These kind of folks are "hard" . . . and "brittle" . . . and "sharp" . . . and you get my drift.

Of course, with any analogy, it never works perfectly. And the difference - at least for me - is this: In the desert, this spacing between plants and the barbs and spines of the plants themselves lend to its beauty and interest. The desert can be very beautiful. With us folks, the separation and barbs we develop from our lack of the living water of the Spirit does nothing but make us uglier and less appealing. None of us enjoy hanging out with people like that.

I just hope I don't become one of those people. How about you?




