

#### **GEYSER-GAZING**

I got back last weekend from a week-long jaunt in Yellowstone National Park. I have been to Yellowstone a number of times in the past but have always wanted to be able to give some time to the geysers – and this trip was for just that.

"Giving some time to the geysers" – what does that mean? When most people think of geysers, they think of Old Faithful, and indeed, that is the premiere geyser in the park – and has become so primarily due to its regularity – hence, "Old Faithful". It erupts every 75 to 90 minutes with such regularity that its eruptions can be accurately predicted in advance with just a 20-minute window. (So when the posted prediction time of "9:30 am" shows up, you can be confident that Old Faithful will do its thing sometimes between 9:20 and 9:40 am.) It's because of this regularity – and because it's right outside the Visitor Center - that Old Faithful is usually the one geyser everybody sees.

However, Old Faithful is not the only geyser in the park – there are literally hundreds of them. It is also not the biggest or the tallest or the most majestic or awe-inspiring. Every geyser is unique, but most people are not able to see many of the others, because most of them are not regular in their eruption times – and could be far away from the Visitor Center. Some erupt just once a day, or others once a week, or others so infrequent that it might be years between eruptions. Visiting the geyser basins in Yellowstone is a matter of serendipity – perhaps I will see one go off... or probably not. What a person needs if they wish to observe geyser eruptions is time, time to be able to sit and wait. And since most tourists – myself included – don't always have time like that, we can only be hopeful that just at the time we are in the area the geyser will do its thing for us. And 99% of the time that doesn't happen. So we come back from Yellowstone having seen a lot of beautiful hot springs, wildlife, scenic vistas . . . and Old Faithful.

That's why I've always wanted to dedicate a trip to Yellowstone for the purpose of having time to see the other geysers erupt. The vast majority of geysers are so irregular that it is not possible to even predict when they might go off. Steamboat Geyser and Giant Geyser, the two biggest geysers in Yellowstone, I have never seen erupt, and will undoubtedly never see. They might go off once a year, or once every five years . . . and who knows on what day and at what hour? But the National Park Service is able to set prediction times for five of the other "big" geysers, and I planned my days in the park around those times. However, those geysers are not a regular as Old Faithful: with Daisy Geyser there is a +/- window of 20 minutes – hence, if the predicted time or eruption for Daisy is 10:35 am, it would be well to be there by 10:15 am and be willing to wait until 10:55 if need be, or maybe a few minutes more. With Castle Geyser there is a +/- of 60 minutes, so you need to be willing to hang around for a couple of hours. Riverside Geyser has a +/- of 45 minutes, Grand Geyser (my favorite) has a +/- of 60 minutes, and Great Fountain Geyser has a +/- of 2 hours!

So one evening Great Fountain was predicted to go at 6:00 pm. I dutifully headed over at 4:00 pm and was expecting I might need to be here until 8:00 pm . . . and it "played" at 6:30 pm. Wowsers! Yikes! The two and a half hour wait was well worth it! For Grand I sat for two hours one day and left a bit despondent as it still hadn't gone off, and I just couldn't sit there any longer. But the next day . . . an hour and a half in . . . the best of all! And I saw Daisy and Castle and Riverside go off – all the "big five" I bagged on this visit because I was willing to sit and wait. And then one evening I did serendipitously witness an eruption of Beehive, which cannot be predicted, but which is stunning in its ferocity – it's like a huge firehose blasting straight up about 200 feet . . . !! I saw all kinds of other things – mainly lots of smaller stuff I had never taken the time for either in the past, but it was those big five geysers that made the trip – and I drove out of the park, my vacation over, the day it started raining . . .

And – of course – this all started me thinking. The key to "geyser-gazing" is time and patience. And it pays off if you're into that kind of thing. And the key to a deep relationship with the living God is time and patience. And that pays off if you're into that kind of thing.

We just need to give more time to God – and be patient with His responses and His workings in our soul and in our lives. We have morphed into such fast-paced, impatient folks that the Lord God has nary a chance to interact with us – and for us to recognize His interactions when He does. He will not surrender to our schedule and agenda – we must surrender to His. And 99% of the time He demands that we give Him some time and much patience in His agenda, not only for our life as a whole, but for our life on each and every day, week, or month. We might demand the fastest internet speed possible . . . but we cannot demand that God comes up to our desired speed. Oh – I suppose we could "demand" it, but He won't respond to our demands. He will do what He will do, when He wants to do it, and in the manner He wills to do it.

Time and patience – it is necessary for geyser-gazing . . . and for a living relationship to Our Father.

#### "It's a Revival!"

Today marks the beginning of a Eucharistic Revival in the United States in hopes of re-igniting our belief in the Real Presence of the Body and Blood of Christ. First off, if you would like an extra devotion to pray, go to page 182 of your missal, or look up "Lauda Sion Sequence" when you get home, and pray that sequential hymn. Now, look at the first verse of our opening hymn: "Soul of My Savior, sanctify my breast; Body of Christ, be thou my saving guest; Blood of my Savior, bathe me in thy tide; Wash me with water flowing from his side." When we talk about becoming one with Christ, we mean it. This hymn helps put to words the kind of union we seek with Jesus in the most holy sacrament of the Eucharist. There is a physical reality that is significant in itself, and then deeper so in the spiritual reality of what that union does for our souls. The rest of our music also deals with the Eucharist in various words. Pray those words today as you sing them, and let's join in the efforts to unite our hearts more deeply to the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ!

### **Eucharistic Faith**

In Bolsena, Italy in 1263, a German priest, Peter of Prague, stopped at Bolsena while on a pilgrimage to Rome. He is described as being a pious priest, but one who found it difficult to believe that Christ was actually present in the consecrated host. While celebrating Mass, blood from the consecrated host started to trickle over his hands onto the altar and the corporal (the small square cloth in the

middle of the altar upon which the chalice and sacred vessels are set for consecration). The priest immediately attempted to hide the blood, but then he interrupted the Mass and asked to be taken to the neighboring city of Orvieto, where Pope

Urban IV was then residing. The Pope listened to the priest's account and sent emissaries to conduct an investigation. When all the facts had been determined, he ordered the bishop of the diocese to bring the host and the linen cloth with the stains of blood to Orvieto. The Pope met the procession and, amid great pomp, and had the relics placed in the cathedral. The linen corporal bearing the spots of blood is still on display in the cathedral of Orvieto. This miracle is among hundreds of recorded Eucharistic Miracles throughout the history of the Church and prompted the Church to add Corpus Christi Solemnity to the Calendar.
