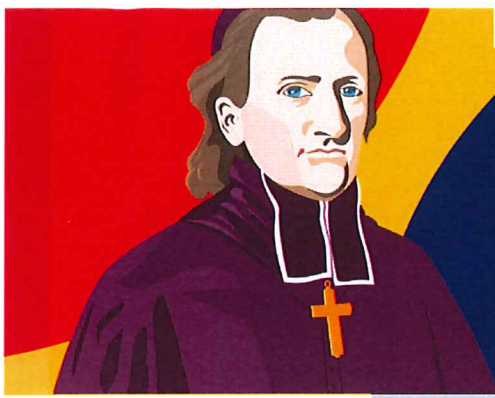


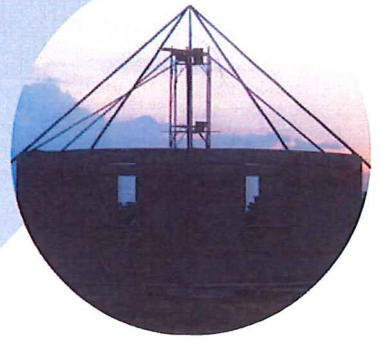
CONSTRUCTION OF A TUKUL ETHIOPIA



What Is a Tukul?

In the village of Gubrye, Ethiopia, children gather in a special kind of building called a Tukul.

It's a round, traditional home made of natural materials like wood, mud, and straw. In Ethiopia, these homes are very common — and now, one Tukul has become a place of learning and love!

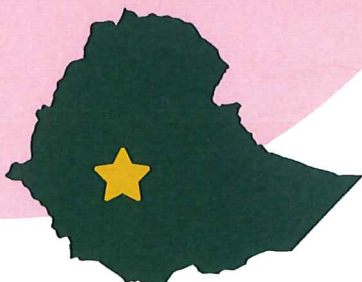


Every week, around 600 children come to this Tukul for:

- Catechism classes to learn about Jesus
- Reading and writing lessons
- Lessons about kindness and caring for others

It's more than a classroom — it's a safe and happy place in the village where children grow in their faith and friendship. Even though they don't have much, the children still make sacrifices for others. During their time together, they collect food and money to help the poorest children in their village — especially those who don't have enough to eat or can't go to school.

They are little missionaries, just like you!
