### **Faith Formation Corner**

### The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

Today's celebration of the Feast of the Holy Family highlights the importance of family in our religious life. We know

that Mary and Joseph's faithfulness to God enabled them to cooperate in God's plan for our salvation by accepting the responsibility to raise God's Son, Jesus. From his parents, Jesus learned how to be a faithful believer in his Jewish tradition. Simeon's prophecy about Mary's sorrow alerts us to the importance of a family's commitment to one another, a commitment that is expressed in both good times and bad.

In this Gospel, Simeon says to Mary that a 'sword of sorrow' would pierce her heart because of Jesus. Can you name a 'sword of sorrow' that you have had to deal with, and what helped you carry that cross?

As you look back to the family you grew up in, what was the faith atmosphere like? What one word of wisdom can you offer to families today? What is one thing today's Gospel says so us that we disciples of Jesus need to heed and act on?
