Faith Formation Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The disciples thought they were going down with the storm and they were afraid. Can you relate to that? As he was with the disciples, is Jesus with you when "violent squalls come up" in your life? What does Pope Francis say can happen if we cry out to Jesus like the disciples did?

Today we can ask ourselves: what are the winds that beat against my life? What are the waves that hinder my navigation, and put my spiritual life, my family life, even my psychological life in danger? Let us say all this to Jesus; let us tell him everything. He wants this; he wants us to grab hold of him to find shelter from the unexpected waves in life. The Gospel recounts that the disciples approach Jesus, wake him, and speak to him.

This is the beginning of our faith: to recognize that alone we are unable to stay afloat; that we need Jesus like sailors need the stars to find their course. Faith begins from believing that we are not enough for ourselves, from feeling in need of God... When we cry out to him, he can work wonders in us. It is the gentle and extraordinary power of prayer, which works miracles.

Pope Francis reminded us that during the corona virus, we were all in the same boat, caught off guard by the turbulence, disoriented and fragile. We needed to row together. What are some things we can work on together to solve some of the world's problems now? Pray? Feed the hungry? Recycle? Build Tiny Homes for the homeless? Care for the sick? Help stop trafficking? Work to prevent discrimination?
