

FROM FR. PAWEL

In the second reading we heard about the faith of Abraham. And indeed, his faith was unconditional and deep. How many of us could sacrifice the best things, the greatest things, relationships or social positions for God if such was His will? Abraham in his obedience to God's will was ready to sacrifice even more, his own son. The son for whom he begged and prayed to God for all his life. The son who was the realization of his dreams and his legacy. The son, promised to him by God Himself. And now the same God is requesting his obedience to sacrifice the life of his son. What an awkward turn of events. What a disturbing and disappointing situation.

We may identify with Abraham at this point. How many times we feel that God is not giving us the grace we ask for. Or how many times we got the grace and then the grace seems be taken away from us, the grace of having the child and then premature death, the grace of love and marriage and then the disappointment that it did not work out, the grace of health that later turns into sickness. We often see God's gifts when they are gone or we take it for granted.

What may the faith of Abraham teach us today?

- 1. When God is asking to sacrifice something important in our lives, He does it for the deeper purpose. In Abraham's situation, it was to test how much Abraham loves God and how far he is willing to go for Him. Abraham proved that even when his heart was broken in pain, he trusted God to the end. Even if sacrificing his son seemed crazy, his faith that God knows what He was doing was greater than his fear or even, from a human point of view, the absurdity of the request. Abraham believed and obeyed. How much does the world, you and me need both of those things; to trust and obey God's will. To believe from all our heart that God loves us and cares for us, even if we do not comprehend sometimes His action in our lives.
- 2. Also, the interaction between Abraham and God shows us that often God is asking but not taking. It is more about the disposition of our hearts and the willingness to trust Him than about what we offer to Him. We fear that if we give away the control over our lives, and the lives of our loved ones and give this power to God, then we are lost. We do not comprehend that by giving we are receiving. We may say "God, I'm giving you my family, my wife, my children use them however you want. Let your will be done". To many of us this kind of prayer may come across as cold and unhuman. It may even terrify us because if God takes seriously upon our prayer what might happen to our beloved, or ourselves? Simply, often we trust ourselves more than God. Therefore, we think that we can take care of our families and ourselves better than God can do it. We think as long as we are in charge of our families, they are relatively safe, but to give my family to God may be too risky.

Abraham is teaching us today that humans have their own limitations, and we need to go beyond it if we love God and others. If we truly want the best for ourselves and those who we love, even if we have some emotional barriers, we overcome them in the act of faith. Why are we so terrified to trust Him? Is it not the time to change that?

WHY SHOULD YOU FILL OUT A CENSUS CARD?

Our records are incomplete and/or inaccurate! Over the years people have come and gone and, unfortunately, our records do not correctly reflect that. Some parishioners think that we should know them because they've "been coming here for years" but perhaps they never registered, are not actively involved, or don't use envelopes. If you aren't registered and don't use church envelopes, we probably don't know who you are or how to reach you!

Just about every week we receive inquiries from other parishes regarding people who want to be godparents for Baptism or sponsors for Confirmation. We are asked if they are "Catholics in good standing" and we cannot honestly answer that question if we don't know you.

Here are some more reasons to register:

- ◆ It gives you sense of belonging in our parish community.
- In good times and bad, you have the support of a faith community.
- It is a commitment to practice your faith.
- Being included in the demographics of the parish helps in planning for the needs of the parish.
- It gives the parish the means to connect with you.
- ◆ In order to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, or Holy Matrimony you will need to be a registered member.
- For religious education instruction and Sacramental preparation, the families of those attending must also be registered parishioners.
- Lastly, to save postage costs, we plan to use email to communicate with parishioners. Our census cards now ask for your email address. (If you don't have email, please let the parish office know and we will use "snail mail" for you.)


