What services are offered by Project Rachel?

Project Rachel is the outreach ministry of the Catholic Church to those who have been wounded by abortion. Active in nearly every diocese in the country for over twenty years, Project Rachel provides a safe and confidential atmosphere to those who seek God's healing. This diocesan based ministry is composed of a network of specially trained clergy, spiritual directors, pastoral care workers, and therapists who can provide compassionate one-on-one care to those who are struggling with the aftermath of abortion.

Project Rachel is an outreach of the Catholic Church, but is open to anyone who is struggling after the pain of an abortion. It is able to help women and men; grandparents, siblings, friends, and others whose lives have been impacted by an abortion loss.

The central focus of Project Rachel is the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession), a privileged place of encounter with God's Mercy, the source of all healing. Through your contact with Project Rachel, you will be able to meet with a priest who will welcome and counsel you in a prayerful atmosphere of respect and sensitivity.

Referral for further counseling is also available to help you find continuing support in the healing process.

A message of hope to women who have had an abortion from Pope John Paul II :

"I would like to say a special word to women who have had an abortion. The Church is aware of the many factors which may have influenced your decision, and she does not doubt that in many cases it was a painful and even shattering decision. The wound in your heart may not yet have healed. Certainly what happened was and remains terribly wrong. But do not give in to discouragement and do not lose hope. Try rather to understand what happened and face it honestly. If you have not already done so, give vourselves over with humility and trust to repentance. The Father of mercies is ready to give you His forgiveness and His peace in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

You will come to understand that nothing is definitively lost and you will also be able to ask forgiveness from your child, who is now living in the Lord. With the friendly and expert help and advice of other people, and as a result of your own painful experience, you can be among the most eloquent defenders of everyone's right to life. Through your commitment to life, whether by accepting the birth of other children or by welcoming and caring for those most in need of someone to be close to them, you will become promoters of a new way of looking at human life."
