Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On March 20, 2020, due to the pandemic and our inability to join in our public celebration of the Eucharist in person, I granted a Dispensation from the Obligation to celebrate Sunday Eucharist. Beginning the weekend of October 8 /9, 2022, The Twenty-Eighth Sunday of Ordinary Time, the dispensation is lifted.

As is the case with any illness, if you are sick, you do not have to go to Sunday Eucharist. This has always been the teaching of the Church. Live-streaming for the celebration of the Sacrament of Eucharist was never meant to be a replacement for being in person. So, if you have not begun to return to Mass at your local parish, I invite you to return to Mass because you are important to the celebration.

Lastly, I announce that as of October 7, 2022, Memorial of our Lady of the Rosary, the offering of the Chalice to the people of God is to be resumed. The General Instruction to the Roman Missal is clear that the fullest expression Communion is when both the Body of Christ and the Precious Blood is offered at every celebration of the Eucharist. Please be assured of my prayers.
