## Santa Rosa Catholic Church - Guideline for Godparents

## **Guidelines for Godparents**

- 1. Each child may have a Godfather and a Godmother, but only one Godparent is necessary.
- 2. Each Godparent must register for a Baptism Preparation Class. If the class is attended at another Catholic Church, then a letter acknowledging their attendance is required.
- 3. If the Godparent or Godparents are not members of Santa Rosa Catholic Church, a letter of "Good Standing" is needed from their parish of attendance. This letter should be received in the church office a minimum of two weeks before the scheduled Baptism.
- 4. The Godparent or Godparents must be at least 16 years old.
- 5. To be a Godparent, one must be a fully initiated Catholic (baptized, confirmed, and received Eucharist).
- 6. A Godparent must be leading a sacramental life in harmony with the church. This means they are attending Mass regularly and receiving the sacraments.
- 7. If married, the Godparent must be married according to the norms of the Catholic Church. If single, a Godparent may not be cohabitating (i.e., "living together" in a marital manner) with a partner.
- 8. The Godparent must be willing to accept the responsibility of assisting the parents in developing the faith life of the child.
- 9. The Godparent may not be the father or mother of the one to be baptized.
- 10. Although people of some cultures sometimes choose multiple Godparents, only two names can be entered in the Baptismal record.
- 11. If you are a parishioner at Santa Rosa Catholic Church and need a letter of "Good Standing" to serve as a Godparent at a baptism in another parish, feel free to contact Patty Chavez at 805-927-4816.
