



FROM THE ARCHIVES

From "The Sisters of Mercy of Harrisburg, 1869-1939" by Sister Mary Veronica McEntee, R.S.M. (The Dolphin Press, 1939):

Again, St. Mary's was fortunate in the choice of a learned rector, the Very Reverend Thomas J. Crotty. He came to Lancaster in the early part of October 1917, but enroute contracted a severe illness which developed into pneumonia and prevented his active services to the parish for several months. His first

appearance at social or educational functions was at the Commencement Exercises in June. He remarked at the close of the exercises that the educational status of the school was made evident by the training which the graduates had received and the manner in which they had acquitted themselves of their respective parts.





Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Notes:

This week as we listened to God with the children...

We've been celebrating God's profuse gifts during the Easter weeks. Today, we anticipate Pentecost as we drape the prayer table with a red cloth. "Red is for Pentecost!" we sing. We read Acts, hearing how Jesus keeps His promise—foretold throughout all of time, in the Old Testament and in His teachings, most recently at the Last Supper—to send the Holy Spirit to the waiting apostles after His death and resurrection. Through these tongues of fire, the apostles are changed. They rush out immediately to tell everyone that Jesus has risen. How is this our story, too? We light seven red candles, each representing a gift of the Holy Spirit (named in Isaiah) that helps us know and love God and one another. We name the gifts. Can we think of a time that we have used and enjoyed one of these gifts? How has the gift changed us? Each of us receives a candle and lights it at the "gift" he or she most wants to receive. As they grow, children may come to see that these are the gifts we use to help build the Kingdom of God here on earth.

In the **Catechesis of the Good Shepherd**, we strive to recognize and be open to the action of the Holy Spirit. According to His plan, God shares the Holy Spirit with each of us—with all human beings—so we can go energetically into the world, sharing love for God.


