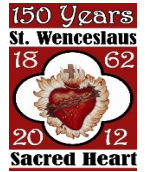

**Reflection from our Pastor:**

Please pray for the Confirmation students who are on retreat this weekend. The retreat is for 3 days at a retreat center in Stewartville, MN. This is our first retreat like this, whereby we seek to give them an opportunity to dive deeper in their faith and prepare well for Confirmation come the Fall.

Two weeks ago, I reflected on almsgiving. Last week I focused on prayer. This week I would like to focus on fasting. As Bishop Fulton Sheen wrote, "The Christian says, 'Begin with the fast and end with the feast, and you will really savor it.' The pagan says, 'Begin with the feast and end with the morning-after headache.'" When we indulge frequently, not only do we harm our health, but we also lower ourselves to the level of what we love. If my world revolves around food, what does that say about my life? Have I reduced myself to the level of a beast, or do I have a deeper purpose for which I live? As Jesus said, "My food is to do the will of Him who sent me" (Jn. 4:34). When we fast, we intentionally deny ourselves of that which we crave, to redirect our craving towards that which is most valuable at the end of the day. When we feel hunger pains we are invited to think, "I hunger for God." "Only He will truly satisfy me."

Fasting also builds our spiritual muscles. The more fasting we do, the stronger our discipline is. With this discipline we are able to endure difficulties in the future with grace, surrender and patience. If we never disciplined ourselves in the past, or built up this muscle, then when suffering comes our way, we are reduced to a childish state of complaining, bitterness and possibly even despair.

Fasting also can be used as an offering. When we fast from what we desire (not just food), we can make it a prayer. We can fast for people who have left the faith. We can fast for the sick and distressed. We can fast for any good intention.

So why not consider fasting more? Not just fasting from meat on Fridays (with our delicious fish-fry's to compensate!) but truly fasting until the discomfort is felt. We focus more on God. We grow in self-discipline/control. We equip ourselves to handle future trials with grace. We can make it a prayer/offering.

**Spend time in Jesus' presence and you will gradually come to know that Jesus is indeed there.**

The desire to strengthen your faith requires some action on your part. It helps to go to the church and spend time with the mindset that Jesus is there. Take your problems and speak with Jesus. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Lord, help me to spend a few minutes in church and speak with You.

## **Stoking the Lenten Fire**

I think we all can acknowledge that there's a certain fatigue that comes over us all as we near the end of the Lenten season. Next week is Laetare Sunday, and I find that as soon as those pink vestments start coming out of storage, our collective motivation begins to wane.

I get that. Maybe you're fatigued — I am, too. Maybe you're doing well in your resolutions and devotions but you're in danger of coasting. Or maybe, like many of us this year or in past years, you don't feel that you have even really begun your Lenten journey.

Either way, chances are that the fire that was in your belly on Ash Wednesday is burning a bit low. All fires eventually do, once they consume whatever fuels them. So here we would do well to remember what fuels our Lenten fire.

Sometimes we make resolutions that have the appearance of being spiritual but also have an earthly motive. We give up chocolate hoping to lose weight. We stop gossiping so our friends may like us more. There is nothing wrong with these sacrifices — just with their motivations.

As Moses removes his sandals to approach the burning bush, he sees that the fire burns brightly, strongly — but does not consume. It is propelled by something inexhaustible, something which is not of this world.

Is your Lenten fire fueled by God? Are you daily surrendering yourself to the same voice that boomed from the bush in Genesis — the voice that commanded the Israelites to do what seemed like the impossible? — Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS
