

Notes from the Pastor:

Our **AFC Holy Hour** this Sunday, April 6th, is an "Emmaus Holy Hour" at the Cathedral from 3-4 pm with a priest available for Confession during that time as well.

This upcoming **Thursday, April 10th,is the Chrism Mass** for the Diocese of New Ulm. This year it is at St. Aloysius in Olivia at 7 pm. If you have not been to a Chrism Mass, I'd like to encourage you to go. It is a Mass where all the priests of the diocese gather to renew their promises and the Bishop blesses all of the oils that are used in the celebration of the Sacraments for the upcoming year.

A discussion between two preschool students at NUACS last week, overheard by a staff member:

Two children were talking at the writing desk...

"I will get to see you when we go to Heaven!

But I will probably be there before you

because I am older than you."

This is probably **the best mission statement for a Catholic school that I have ever heard**, and is the very center of what we are about –getting to Heaven.

And just a note that Karen Schulte, who has been the St. Anthony Elementary principal, announced that she is not returning next school year, so we are in the process of looking for her replacement. Karen commutes back and forth from Bird Island each day, and it has gotten to be too much driving for her. Thanks, Karen, for your contributions to NUACS over these past years!

Another NUACS point that I think is worth mentioning, that people who do not have children in school may not know the Junior/Senior High program has a new cell phone policy. At the beginning of the school day, each student places his/her cell phone in a "pouch" (called a "Yondr pouch") that is closed with a magnetic lock (similar to the ones that stores use to prevent theft), and they get them back at the end of the school day. If a student would need to contact a parent during the day, he/she can go to the office to get the pouch unlocked and make a call in the office. This system has been adopted by many schools across the country already and is shown to encourage social interaction and remove distractions from academic work. With all the blessings that technology brings, it also brings some negative "side effects" and attachments that many of us did not have in our lives when we were in school. Before arriving in New Ulm, I did some teaching at St. Mary's in Sleepy Eye, so I am excited about seeing how this will help our students! (I am told that some parents have even asked for a pouch for their children at home!

I have been asked a few times about the fact that we separate out the "Adult Actual" from the "Loose Plate." We budget separate lines for each of these, but put the "Adult Budget" in the bulletin because it is the bigger portion of the weekly collection which gives a good idea of where we are in comparison to our annual goal. For the larger parishes, the loose plate can vary quite a bit from week to week. Ultimately we are grateful for however people contribute to "the bottom line" as we pay our bills, but the "Adult Actual" and "Adult Budget" each week in the bulletin are meant to keep everyone informed of the "big picture" of our finances. More and more we are seeing people also sign up for some form of "on line giving" which is also included in the "Year-to-date" amounts that are listed in the bulletin. (If you would like to get "set up" with on-line contributions, please let us know, and we can assist you with that.)

Looking at the financial/stewardship box, I would like to thank everyone who has contributed to the DMA. I see a few envelopes trickle in yet every week. The DMA subsidizes many programs on the diocesan level that we cannot provide for ourselves.
