Dear Parishioners,


Palm Sunday always brings out such a sharp contrast; the joyful praises and greetings welcoming Jesus into Jerusalem remembered in the first Gospel proclaimed at the door, and then the Passion of the Lord proclaimed as the Gospel of the Mass. In such a short time the people went from welcoming Jesus into the Jerusalem to crying out "Crucify Him!" This contrast brings out the complexity that can be a part of our relationship with Jesus as we can find ourselves vacillating between following Jesus with our whole heart, mind, and strength and falling into sin. As hard as it is to participate in shouting out the words "Crucify Him!" we must accept that any sin in our own lives is the same kind of rejection of the Lord. When I consider this I get unsettled considering the power of sin in my own life, but at the same time I take great comfort in re-

membering the Mercy of God made real most vividly from the Cross itself, with the words of Jesus in agony, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do."

After the triumphant entry Jesus tells His disciples once again about His coming death. It is not triumphalism on display though, and we hear something of Jesus' own emotion as He enters into this first Holy Week when He says "Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say—'Father, save me from this hour? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." (JN 12:27-28) God is about the work of saving His people, willing to pay any price that salvation requires. It is not death for death's sake, but for a higher purpose. It is for love. Jesus says "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honor." (JN 12:23-26)

To follow Jesus I die to myself and live for the Lord. This means to overcome the tendencies to sin in my life wherever they are. We are blessed with the Sacrament of Reconciliation that those mistakes we make are forgiven in the "Court of Mercy" which is the confessional. Do not deprive yourself of this grace! It is not unusual for me to hear Catholics say "I believe I can go to God directly and ask Him for forgiveness... I don't have to go to Confession." To say this is to deny the Sacrament that Jesus Himself gave us as the ordinary way for us to receive His mercy. We do go to Jesus directly in prayer in *extraordinary* circumstances...like for example, if I am hanging on the to the railing of a sinking ship I am going to spend my final moments begging the Lord for mercy. Jesus has given us a way to receive that mercy for the times we are not on a sinking ship or a spiraling airplane. I say it again; do not deprive yourself of this grace!

One thing I enjoy about being a priest is that I get to read the part of Jesus in the Gospel this weekend, and I don't have to shout out "Crucify Him! Crucify Him!" It always made me uncomfortable and I can't imagine that if I were there I would have joined in with the crowd shouting those shameful words. But in truth I shout them out each time I sin. My sin constantly points out the great chasm that exists between me and God and it makes me uncomfortable. My joy at Easter, indeed everyone's joy at Easter is in the fact that in spite of my sin Jesus has done what He has done. He has paid the debt for our sins, and out of perfect love has bridged the chasm that separates us from God. This Palm Sunday we truly have cause to wave our branches and welcome Him once again, this time into our hearts, and proclaim "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!" ~Father Chris








The Weeping Tree




