Parish Finance Council Summary Chad Laliberte

Overall financial theme for past several years in Billerica...

- Operating Expenses have historically exceeded Offertory over the past decade
 - Annual Operating Expenses are between \$1 million and \$1.4 million
 - Annual Offertories typically ranged between \$900,000 to \$1.1 million
- > How does this compare to pre-pandemic figures?
 - Attendance is down more than 50%
 - Offertories have <u>fallen 30%</u>

FY2021 – Operating Net Loss lowered significantly due to forgiveness of Pandemic PPP loans and significant financial assistance from Archdiocese of Boston Mass Attendance - Significant portion of fiscal year, there were no in-person masses or remote mass watching was widespread due to the pandemic

Monthly Offertory Shortfall per Household

Based on current attendance levels (725 parishioners ÷ 3 [average size per household]) = 242 households

PROS

- Centrally located
- Shell of church building is sound
- Sufficient parking
- Present church building has room for growth
- Living space for clergy
- Space for Parish Offices,
 community events (parish hall)
 & Faith Formation
- Saint Matthew owns the property
- Eventually Possibility of sellingSt. Andrew property

CONS

- A large number of repairs are needed.
 - These are costly repairs and maintenance needed to bring the church, rectory and hall to where they need to be.
- Renovation could take more time and money
- Current church building space is larger than needed
- Not fully handicap accessible

Possibility of New Church Building

PROS

- NEW church building
- Space size St. Matthew would need
- Up to date

CONS

- Difficult for Saint Matthew the Evangelist based on current level of giving
- Cost prohibitive

Present Saint Andrew Church

PROS

- Church building needs some repairs
- Less work needed on church building
- Space size the approximate size St. Matthew would currently need
- > St. Matthew owns the property
- Eventually- sell St. Theresa property
- Fully handicap accessible

CONS

- Not centrally located
- Could be difficult for elderly & those needing assistance
- Not sufficient parking
- No room for growth
- Does not have
 - ➤ Living space for clergy **
 - ➤ Parish Office space **
 - Sufficient space for Faith Formation and community events **
