Reflection on Sacred Scripture for the Third Sunday of Lent

What was the Samaritan woman looking for in those six men? Pope Benedict XVI wrote that "she thirsts for life itself and that all the assuaging that she seeks and finds cannot slake this living, elemental thirst... There comes to light the real dilemma, the deep seated waywardness, of her existence: she is brought face to face with herself." What brings this about is an encounter with Jesus. From our own deep thirst for love, for salvation, for meaning, we give ourselves to the One who in his thirst asks us for a drink, just as he will thirst – thirst for our souls – from the cross. We are certain that at last we will "have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." Our "hope does not disappoint." We will not die in our thirst. The Lord is in our midst. Finally satisfaction can happen; this is the Love we have been waiting for.

Whether prayer is expressed in words or gestures, it is the whole man who prays. But in naming the source of prayer, Scripture speaks sometimes of the soul or spirit, but most often of the heart (more than a thousand times). According to Scripture, it is the heart that prays. If our heart is far from God, the words of prayer are in vain...The heart is our hidden center, beyond the grasp of our reason and of others; only the Spirit of God can fathom the human heart and know it fully...It is the place of truth, where we choose life or death. It is the place of encounter, because as image of God we live in relation: it is the place of covenant.
