

What is a cherished Christmas memory between the ages of 5 - 15 years old? Delivering gifts to those in need during the holidays.


Gospel Reflection for the Fourth Sunday of Advent

Life is troubling. Who among us has not struggled with anxiety and difficulties, sometimes massive ones? I certainly have, as have many of my loved ones.

I don't think so. How encouraging for us anxious and troubled souls to hear Luke describe the Blessed Mother Mary in these words, "But she was greatly troubled at what was said." An archangel has visited her. An inconceivable promise has been made to her. Her life has become wildly unpredictable, perhaps more so than any person before or since. The first point for us: the Lord is with her *precisely when she is troubled*. Her anxiousness and God's presence are not mutually exclusive. Christianity is not about a trance-like robotic indifference. It's about the presence of divine love. Even in — especially in — troubled circumstances.

Our troubled soul can become our greatest treasure. What seems so troubling at first to Mary becomes the best possible thing, Jesus, the Savior and Lord, is now her son. All the difficulties and troubles remain, and yet her movement into the fullness of God is accelerated. What is troubling you right now? This scripture invites us now, this week, to hear the Lord's messenger say to us what he said to Mary, "Do not be afraid! You have found favor with God."


Gospel Reflection for the Nativity of the Lord, Christmas Day

"She gave birth to her firstborn son." The pain of childbirth is something that boggles my mind. I'm sure I couldn't handle it. I can't even watch scenes in movies in which a woman gives birth. I understand it's a beautiful part of nature, but there's still something awful about it and the attendant suffering.

Which is why it's worth pondering an often neglected and currently unpopular part of the Church's theology around the birth of Christ, his was miraculous because it caused no pain to his mother. Even her physical virginity remains intact. Of course, we modern scientific people scoff at such an idea.

Without obsessing over the obstetrical details, we discover a glorious illumination in the symbolic meaning of this birth that we moderns find so embarrassing. *God comes into the world in an utterly non-violent way*. He himself will suffer his own bloodshed but will never shed that of others. He is so peaceful and non-violent that he will even rise from the dead without breaking the seal of the tomb. All of humanity, in the Church, will give birth to him in the Church free from the terrible pain due to original sin. How badly we need the truth of this miraculous birth today!

Let's delight in this great mystery and miracle of Jesus's birth. He is the Prince of Peace and always nonviolent. We need not fear him, ever.

Dear Holy Trinity Parish Families,

Last year, Angel Scholarship Fund (ASF) donations amounted to \$130,000 which was used to help reduce the tuition for 92 students at Holy Trinity School (HTS). The ASF allows you to direct a portion of your Ohio state income taxes towards supporting HTS.

It's crucial to highlight that this isn't just a deduction – it's a tax credit. When you donate to this fund, every dollar you give serves as a credit on your taxes up to \$750 per single filer or \$1,500 per married couple filing jointly.

Timing is of the essence with respect to this initiative. While contributions made by April 15, 2024 will apply to the 2023 tax year, only donations made by January 31, 2024 can be used for the upcoming 2024/2025 school year. Donations after January 31, 2024 will apply to the 2025/2026 school year.

It is essential to recognize the significance of the ASF even in light of the existence of Ed Choice funding. While Ed Choice provides substantial assistance, certain families may not qualify for significant support. The ASF serves as a crucial supplemental resource, particularly for those families facing financial constraints in the context of escalating educational costs.

In the past year, we proudly ranked among the top five parishes with the highest amount of donations. With your continued support this will lighten the parish subsidy toward the school and grow the offerings for our parish community. In essence it is a win-win-win. We thank you for your continued support toward Catholic education.


