GOSPEL REFLECTION

Here we are on our second Sunday of Lent. How is your Lent going? Where is your heart? We are just beginning our climb to the top of the mountain. Sacrifice and prayer often have many rewards but, without a doubt, bring challenges. Every strong relationship requires sacrifice.

Think about the way husbands and wives sacrifice for each other or their children. Just this past weekend, I had the opportunity to spend an evening with my daughter in a mall overnight lock-in. It was beautiful to see her excitement, but I indeed sacrificed sleep. Yet, I was blessed to meet other mothers and daughters who shared in both sacrifice and joy.

Last Wednesday, I witnessed Fr. Deo, who had little rest since returning home from a family funeral in Tanzania, preside over multiple Ash Wednesday masses, have a surprise preschool visit, and provide an orientation to a new priest in the diocese. He had to be so tired, yet he did all of this with a smile. A sacrifice he made to the Church.

When reading the scriptures for this weekend, my heart and mind instantly went to the words of the second reading, "Brothers and sisters: If God is for us, who can be against us?" Often, I think that is the interesting part of our Lenten journey. Who, like God, is supporting us, who is FOR US? We are in the desert, and we desire to be with Peter, John, and James at the top of the mountain. We yearn for that encounter. And with our sacrifice, giving, and prayer, we do what we can to stay focused on Jesus. And yet, sometimes we hear a discouraging word, a voice not supporting us in our relationship with Jesus. It is in these moments that we must remember who is FOR US - who is supporting, encouraging, and loving us on this road to holiness. May you continue to have a blessed Lent.






