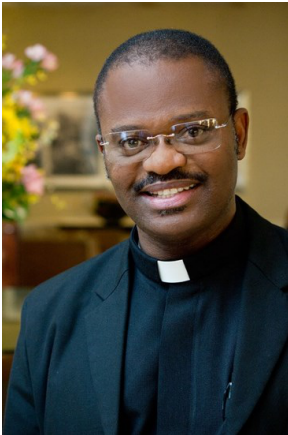

PALM SUNDAY OF THE LORD'S PASSION



PASTOR'S CORNER

It was Palm Sunday and little Annie's family was getting ready for Mass. Everything was going well until her mother checked in on the little girl. "Mommy, I have a sore throat." "Oh no, sweetie," said her mother, "and it feels like you have a fever as well, you better stay home this morning." And so, little Annie stayed home and rested. When her family returned with palm fronds, she immediately sprang up. "What are the palms for, daddy?" So her father told her, "When Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey, the crowds laid down palm fronds for their king."

Little Annie was confused, "What's a donkey?" "It's a like a little horse," answered her father. "Aw, of all the rotten luck! The one day I have to stay home from church and Jesus throws a pony party!"

Letting Go of Desires and Expectations

Dear St. Paul parishioners,

Today we start the holiest season of all liturgical seasons—the Holy Week.

The reading for the procession for Palm Sunday Year B tells the story of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, where he is greeted with shouts of "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" The people were excited and hopeful that Jesus would be the one to liberate them from Roman rule and restore the glory of Israel. However, when we get to the Passion reading, we see that things did not turn out as they had hoped. In these later passages, we witness Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion. He is betrayed by one of his own disciples, denied by another, and abandoned by most. He is mocked, beaten, and ultimately killed on a cross. As we reflect on these two passages together, we are reminded of the fickle nature of human beings. The same people who welcomed Jesus with open arms in Mark 11, were the ones who turned on him in Mark 14-15. They allowed their own expectations and desires to cloud their judgment, and they failed to see the true mission and message of Jesus.

This can serve as a warning to us as well. It is easy for us to get caught up in our own desires and expectations, and to lose sight of the bigger picture. We may think that we know what is best for ourselves and for the world but, in reality, our knowledge and understanding are limited. The readings for Palm Sunday Year B remind us that God's ways are not our ways, and that sometimes we must be willing to

let go of our own expectations and trust in God's plan. Jesus' death on the cross was not the end, but rather the beginning of a new hope and a new life. It was through his sacrifice that we are saved, and it is through our own willingness to surrender our own desires and follow him that we can experience true freedom and salvation.

Let us reflect on these passages for Palm Sunday with humility and openness, recognizing our own imitations and weaknesses, and trusting in the infinite wisdom and love of God. May we be willing to let go of our own expectations and desires, and follow Jesus with faith and courage, even when the road ahead seems uncertain or difficult. Let us remember that just as Jesus' suffering and death led to new life and resurrection, so too will our own sufferings be transformed into new life in Christ. May we be strengthened by the example of Jesus, and may we journey with him through the Holy Week into the glory of Easter Sunday.

DID YOU KNOW?

Maundy Thursday is the beginning of the Sacred Triduum (the most holy three days in Christianity). From its ancient origins, the traditions of Holy Thursday have not changed much. These include *exmologesis*—an organized reconciliation for multiple penitents*, *olei exorcizati consecration*—consecration of the holy oils**, and *pedilavium*—the washing of the feet. Most importantly, Maundy Thursday is the anniversary of the Lord’s Supper. We worship at the liturgy of the Eucharist because of the original Mass.

*Nowadays, we move the large scale penance service to an earlier day out of convenience. **The modern day Chrism Mass is celebrated at the cathedral with all of the priests present.
