PASTOR'S CORNER

A little boy was saying his bedtime prayers and ended with, "And please, Lord, bless Mommy, Daddy, Grandma, and Grandpa." Then he paused and added, "Oh, and please take care of yourself too, God – if anything happens to You, we're all in big trouble!" Even children remind us – we really do depend on God for everything! Let's remember to thank Him not just for what He gives, but for who He is.

In this Sunday's Gospel (Luke 17:11-19), we encounter a story that is both simple and profoundly human. Ten lepers cry out to Jesus for mercy as He passes along the border between Samaria and Galilee. They stand at a distance – as they must – because leprosy not only destroyed the body but also isolated a person from family, community, and worship. It was not just a physical illness, but a social and spiritual exile.

And then comes the miracle. Jesus does not touch them, nor does He perform a dramatic gesture. He simply says, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And as they go, they are cleansed. It's a beautiful image of faith in motion – they trusted enough to obey before the miracle even happened.

But then the story takes a turn. Out of the ten who are healed, only one returns – a Samaritan, someone doubly excluded, both as a leper and as a foreigner. He falls at Jesus' feet, glorifying God and giving thanks. Jesus notices, of course, and asks the haunting question: "Were not ten made clean? Where are the other nine?"

This Gospel is not simply about being polite or remembering to say "thank you." It is about something deeper – a grateful heart that recognizes the Giver behind the gift. The nine were healed, but only the one who returned was *made whole*. There is a difference between being cured on the outside and being healed on the inside. Gratitude has the power to do both.

Gratitude opens our eyes to the presence of God in our daily lives. When we practice it intentionally, we begin to see grace in unexpected places – in the kindness of a stranger, in a quiet morning, in a meal shared with loved ones, in the forgiveness we receive. Gratitude keeps us grounded in humility and joy, reminding us that everything we have – our faith, our breath, our very life – is a gift.

It's easy to forget to be grateful, especially when life feels routine or burdensome. We can get caught up in what's missing, what's broken, or what's next on our to-do list. But the Samaritan leper teaches us that gratitude is not just a response to blessings – it's a choice, a way of living. Even before everything is perfect, we can still recognize the goodness of God.

This week, I invite you to make a little spiritual exercise: At the end of each day, pause for a moment and name three things

you are grateful for – large or small. It might be a good meal, a moment of laughter, a problem solved, or simply the grace of having made it through another day. As you do, whisper a prayer of thanks to God. Over time, this simple habit can soften your heart, lift your spirit, and draw you closer to the One who gives all good gifts.

Let us be among the grateful ones – the ones who return to Jesus, not just when things are hard, but when things are good. Let's live as people whose hearts have been made whole by thanksgiving.

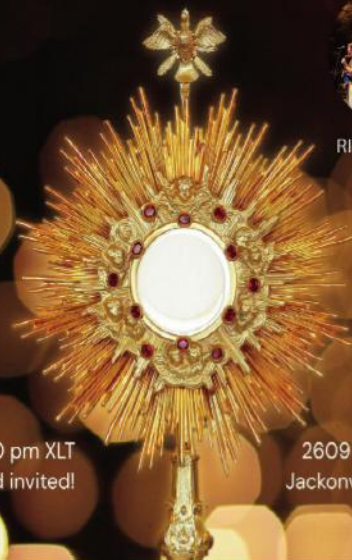
