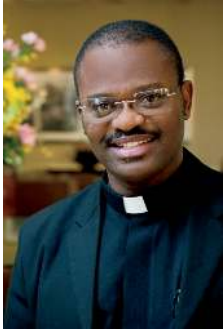

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear St. Paul's family, friends, and visitors,

*Let's begin with a little light humor:
Why did the disciples love staying with Jesus? Because He always said, "There's plenty of room!"*

This Sunday's Gospel from the Gospel of John gives us one of the most comforting and well-known promises of Jesus: "In my Father's house there are many dwelling places." In a world that can often feel uncertain or unsettled, Jesus speaks directly to our hearts with reassurance. He reminds us that we are not wandering aimlessly, but journeying toward a home prepared just for us.

The disciples, especially Thomas the Apostle, express a very human concern: "Lord, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?" It's a question many of us carry in different seasons of life. Where am I going? What is God asking of me? Am I on the right path? Jesus' response is both simple and profound: "I am the way and the truth and the life." He doesn't hand them a map or a list of directions. Instead, He offers Himself. The Christian life is not about figuring everything out perfectly. It's about staying close to Jesus, trusting that walking with Him is the way forward.

In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we see the early Church facing challenges—real, practical ones. There were disagreements and needs that required attention. Rather than becoming divided, the apostles responded with wisdom, calling forward others to serve. This reminds us that the Church grows stronger when each person steps into their role with generosity and faith. We are all part of building up the Body of Christ.

And in the second reading from the First Letter of

St. Peter, we are reminded that we are "living stones," being built into a spiritual house. Each one of us matters. Each one of us has a place. God is actively shaping something beautiful through our lives, even when we don't fully see it yet.

So, what does this mean for us this week? It means trusting Jesus even when the path isn't clear. It means remembering that we belong—we have a place in God's house. And it means allowing ourselves to be part of something bigger, serving one another with love.

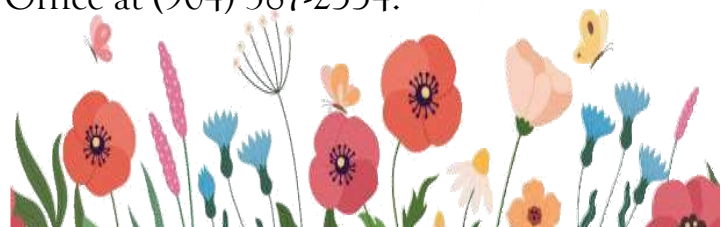

STEWARDSHIP—26 APR 2026

Today's Scripture readings hold powerful stewardship messages. In St. John's Gospel, Jesus informs the Apostles – and us – that He is the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me. Our discipleship in Christ instituted at our Baptism, which draws us closer to Him, paves the way to the Father. In the Acts of the Apostles, the Christian community in Jerusalem appoints deacons to show the significance of sharing resources with those brothers and sisters in need. In St. Peter's First Letter, he reminds us that while accepting our Lord's gift of faith makes us special to God, faith comes at a high cost. Christian stewards acknowledge faith as a gift built from the graces flowing from praying daily, attending Mass regularly and receiving Holy Communion, and reading Scripture. In our continuing stewardship journey, do we use God's graces and gifts to strengthen our faith, so that we can then share that faith with those we encounter?
