Santa Mónica

ónica nació en Tagaste, en lo que hoy es Algeria. A esta mujer laica de la zona norte de África la casaron con Patricio, un romano pagano. San Agustín, quien más adelante se convertiría en santo, fue el hijo mayor de Mónica. Ella trató de criarlo como cristiano pero, a la vez, se preocupaba por su éxito en el mundo y lo envió a estudiar a Cartago. Sus oraciones exno en el minuto y to envio a estudiar a carragió. Sus oraciones aquidaron a que su esposo y su suegra se convirtieran al cristianismo Sus otros dos hijos, Navigio y Perpetua, eran conocidos por su superioridad moral y, más adelante, Perpetua ingresó a la vida religiosa. Pero Agustín, para consternación de Mónica, se unió a la secta herética maniquea. Agustín despreciaba al cristianismo y llegó a tener un hijo con su amante. En el año 383, Mónica, buscando la conversión de su hermano, lo siguió a Italia en donde ella se convirtió en seguidora de san Ambrosio a quien solicitó que interviniera con Agustín. Tres años más tarde, Agustín fue bautizado por san Ambrosio. Poco después, Mónica cayó enferma y falleció antes de poder regresar a África. Años antes, un obispo la consoló con esta famosa frase: "no se perderá el hijo de tantas lágrimas".



El 27 de agosto celebraremos el memorial de Santa Mónica, madre de San Agustín, A la intercesión de estos santos confiemos a los recién casados y padres cristianos quienes, como Mónica, puedan acompañar con el ejemplo y la oración el camino de sus hijos. Saint Monica

FEAST DAY: AUGUST 27

orn in Tagaste in present-day Algeria, this North African lay woman was given in marriage to Patricius, a Roman pagan.

St. Augustine of Hippo, a saint in the making, was their eldest child. Monica tried to bring him up a Christian but was also concerned for his worldly success and sent him to Carthage to study. Her prayers helped the conversion of both her husband and her mother-inlaw to Christ. Her two other children, Navigius and Perpetua, were also known for righteousness, and Perpetua eventually entered religious life. But Augustine, to Monica's dismay, joined the heretical Manichean sect. He scorned Christianity and had a son with his mistress. In 383, Monica sought his conversion and followed Augustine to Italy, where she became a follower of St. Ambrose and asked for his intervention with Augustine. Three year later, Augustine was baptized by St. Ambrose. Monica fell ill shortly after and died before their return to Africa. Years before, a bishop had famously counseled her, "It is not possible that the son of so many tears should be lost."



[August 27] we will celebrate the memory of St Monica, Mother of St Augustine. To the intercession of these Saints let us entrust Christian newlyweds and parents, that like Monica, they may accompany by example and prayer the journey of their children. Let us commend the sick who are most in need of comfort and constant attention as well as young people that, like Augustine, they may move towards the fullness of Truth and Love, which is Christ: he alone can satisfy the deep needs of the human heart.

Lithuanian Community

On August 17th Rev. William Kennedy, pastor, celebrated the 10:30 Mass at St. Peter Lithuanian Parish. Egle Slezas was lector and Gabriel Cunninham was Eucharistic Minister. The altar servers were Zilvinas and Nomeda Cunningham. Jack McGowan and Anthony Abidauod were ushers. Daiva Navickas led the congregation in singing and accompanied on the organ.

In his homily Fr. Kennedy commented on the paradox that in today's scripture passage Jesus, often called the Prince of Peace, is telling his followers that he has come "to set the earth of fire." Further Jesus says that he has come to bring division. In the first reading the prophet Jeremiah is persecuted because the princes don't like what he is saying. Fr. Kennedy urged the congregation to speak up about truth and not shy away from difficult discussions whether they be about simple things such as what a child is wearing to school or more complicated such as the church teachings about gender. Fr. Kennedy gave examples from his time as chaplain in the military of government policies that contradicted Church teachings and about which he spoke up. The second reading encourages all " to persevere in running the race that lies before us while keepping our eyes fixed on Jesus."

The "kavute" after Mass was prepared by Aldona Lingertat with assistance from Anthony Abidaoud and many others who offered to help.

Beginnning Wednesday August 20th through the Sunday 24th Camp Neringa will be hosting an adult camp session: Cultural Days. Each day a number of workshops will be scheduled including in art, weaving, writing, culinary arts, dance and singing. Each evening will have a specific evening program which will include a viewing of a Lithuanian comedy film "Gardute," a Literature Night, a concert by Kristina Malinauskaite, soprano with Dalia Sakas accompanying, and a presentation by Vytas Ciuplinskas of his photo project, Riverside Observed. Each evening will have a prayer time in the chapel. Fr. Algis Malikauskis, OFM will say Mass on Saturday evening. If interested register at: Camp Neringa.org. All are invited.


