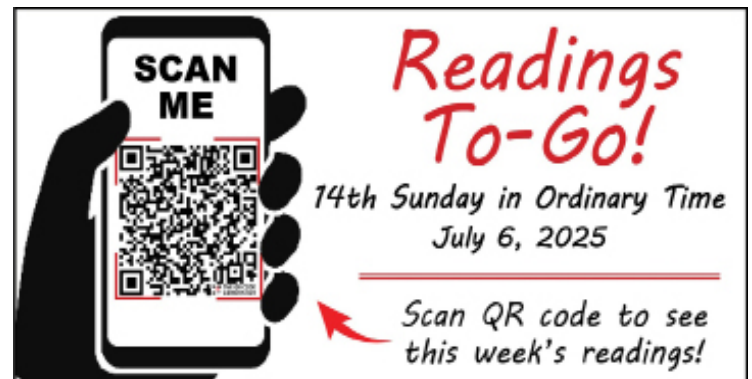

News from the Wheel-House

Dear parish family,

God bless us and our great nation, America!

Having gone through a very difficult time because of the great loss of beloved Deacon Joe Belmonte and still reeling with the impacts of it here we are again in the presence of God to worship Him and celebrate His love. As we hold ourselves in His presence, offering His generous graces He calls us not to stay stuck and live in the past pain and despair but to realize the presence and make our future a blessed one. This is what we hear from this weekend's first reading (Isaiah 66/10) "Thus says the LORD: Rejoice with Jerusalem and be glad because of her, all you who love her; exult, exult with her, all you who were mourning ..." The present, what we are in is that we are having a long weekend because of July 4th, Our great Nation's Independence Day, the Birth Day of our country. Celebrating it already we might have taken the time to throw a huge BBQ with festive drinks and desserts, dress up in red, white and blue or even sought out the best spots to watch fireworks. In the midst of tons of activities and the busyness of the holiday, we should also take the time to reflect on the importance of the day at the back drop of this weekend's readings.

Folks, through our nations' great history that many great Christian men were instrumental in our nation's founding and Patrick Henry was one such man, a famous statesman and orator from Virginia, he served in the House of Burgesses, was a delegate to the Continental Congress, where before the Virginia Provincial Convention which was deeply divided between revolutionaries and loyalists, he uttered his most famous words: "Give me liberty or give me death." During the Revolutionary War he became commander-in-chief of Virginia's military forces, helped draw up the Virginia constitution, as well as several amendments to our Constitution which became known as the "Bill of Rights". He became Virginia's first governor and was re-elected by a grateful people 4 times! Now listen what this early and influential patriot said: "It cannot be emphasized too strongly or too often that this great nation was founded not by religionists, but by Christians – not on religions, but on the Gospel of Jesus Christ." Henry's Last Will and Testament was interesting. He bequeathed all of his property to his children. Nothing unusual there! However, the last paragraph of his will read: "I have now given everything I own to my children. There is one more thing I wish I could give them and that is Christ! Because if they have everything, I gave them and don't have Christ, they have nothing.

" I love reading stories about our patriots and founders who gave so valiantly of themselves so we could be free. Yet, this is what we need to be reminded of a solemn warning God gave another nation, 1000's of yrs. ago which was experiencing the same thrill of independence after 400 yrs. of Egyptian slavery.

At the exciting time period in life of Jewish people who were on the verge of Promised Land about to go in and conquer the land after 400 years of slavery, 40 yrs. of wandering God exhorted them through Moses that how they have to be in their new land. The first thing that He asked them is to remember God's faithful dealings and learn humility.) Everything in our country today is a struggle for pride, pride, pride! and because of that we experience often the arrogance, folly, and not caring for others. In our life when we admit that God is the giver and every good gift is from him, we will be all the more humble. Woody Allen is credited with saying, "If you want to make God laugh, tell him your plans." We could add to it, "If you want to hear him laugh even louder, tell him how much you know."

Folks when we are humble, our Bible promises that the peace of Christ control our hearts and the joy of our life will be ours. In this weekend's gospel we hear that the harvest is rich but the laborers are few. Yes, the peace and blessings of God, the harvest is at our hand and calling us to aspire for it by being humble and work for it by living the calls of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. "Learn from me that I am meek and humble of God". When the apostles became humble and started to appreciate the gifts of God, they became awesome people doing awesome deeds to make this world a better place. Let us follow their example! May God bless us all!

Noticias desde la Casa del Timón

Si alguna vez olvidamos que somos una sola nación bajo Dios, seremos una nación en decadencia.

Querida familia parroquial:

¡Que Dios nos bendiga a nosotros y a nuestra gran nación, Estados Unidos!

Tras haber pasado por un momento muy difícil debido a la gran pérdida del amado diácono Joe Belmonte y aún conmocionados por el impacto de esta, aquí estamos nuevamente en la presencia de Dios para adorarlo y celebrar su amor. Al permanecer en su presencia, ofreciendo sus generosas gracias, Él nos llama a no quedarnos estancados en el dolor y la desesperación del pasado, sino a reconocer su presencia y a construir un futuro bendecido. Esto es lo que escuchamos de la primera lectura de este fin de semana (Isaías 66:10): «Así dice el Señor: Alegraos con Jerusalén y regocijaos por ella, todos los que la amáis; regocijaos, regocijaos con ella, todos los que estabais de luto...».

En el presente, nos encontramos en un fin de semana largo debido al 4 de julio, el Día de la Independencia de nuestra gran nación, el cumpleaños de nuestro país. Si ya lo celebráramos, quizá nos hubiéramos tomado el tiempo para organizar una gran barbacoa con bebidas y postres festivos, vestirmos de rojo, blanco y azul o incluso buscar los mejores lugares para ver los fuegos artificiales. En medio de la gran cantidad de actividades y el ajetreo de la festividad, también deberíamos tomarnos un tiempo para reflexionar sobre la importancia de este día, que es el telón de fondo de las lecturas de este fin de semana.

Amigos, a lo largo de la gran historia de nuestra nación, muchos grandes hombres cristianos fueron fundamentales en su fundación, y Patrick Henry fue uno de ellos, un famoso estadista y orador de Virginia. Sirvió en la Cámara de los Burgueses y fue delegado del Congreso Continental, donde, ante la Convención Provincial de Virginia, profundamente dividida entre revolucionarios y leales, pronunció sus palabras más famosas: “Dadme la libertad o dadme la muerte”. Durante la Guerra de la Independencia, se convirtió en comandante en jefe de las fuerzas militares de Virginia, ayudó a redactar la constitución de Virginia, así como varias enmiendas a nuestra Constitución, conocidas como la “Declaración de Derechos”. Se convirtió en el primer gobernador de Virginia y fue reelegido cuatro veces por un pueblo agradecido. Escuchen lo que dijo este pionero e influyente patriota: “No se puede enfatizar demasiado que esta gran nación no fue fundada por religiosos, sino por cristianos; no sobre religiones, sino sobre el Evangelio de Jesucristo”. El testamento de Henry fue interesante. Legó todos sus bienes a sus hijos. ¡Nada inusual! Sin embargo, el último párrafo de su testamento decía: «Ya les he dado todo lo que tengo a mis hijos. Hay algo más que quisiera darles: ¡a Cristo! Porque si lo tienen todo, se lo di y no tienen a Cristo, no tienen nada».

Me encanta leer historias sobre nuestros patriotas y fundadores, quienes se entregaron con tanta valentía para que pudiéramos ser libres. Sin embargo, esto es lo que necesitamos recordar de una solemne advertencia que Dios dio a otra nación, hace miles de años, que experimentaba la misma emoción de la independencia después de 400 años de esclavitud en Egipto.

En el emocionante período de la vida del pueblo judío, que estaba a punto de entrar en la Tierra Prometida y conquistarla después de 400 años de esclavitud y 40 años de peregrinación, Dios los exhortó a través de Moisés sobre cómo debían comportarse en su nueva tierra. Lo primero que les pidió fue recordar la fidelidad de Dios y aprender humildad. Hoy en día, todo en nuestro país es una lucha por el orgullo, el orgullo, el orgullo. Y debido a eso, a menudo experimentamos la arrogancia, la insensatez y la indiferencia hacia los demás. En nuestra vida, cuando admitimos que Dios es el dador y que todo buen regalo proviene de él, seremos aún más humildes. A Woody Allen se le atribuye la frase: “Si quieres hacer reír a Dios, cuéntale tus planes”. Podríamos añadir: “Si quieres oírlo reír aún más fuerte, dile cuánto sabes”. Amigos, cuando somos humildes, la Biblia promete que la paz de Cristo controlará nuestros corazones y la alegría de nuestra vida será nuestra. En el evangelio de este fin de semana, escuchamos que la mies es abundante, pero los obreros son pocos. Sí, la paz y las bendiciones de Dios, la mies están a nuestra mano y nos llaman a aspirar a ella siendo humildes y trabajando por ella, viviendo el llamado del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. “Aprendan de mí que soy manso y humilde ante Dios”. Cuando los apóstoles se volvieron humildes y comenzaron a apreciar los dones de Dios, se convirtieron en personas extraordinarias que realizaron obras extraordinarias para hacer de este mundo un lugar mejor. ¡Sigamos su ejemplo! ¡Que Dios nos bendiga a todos!

person lives there, your peace will rest on him; but if not,
it will return to you. Stay in the same house and eat and drink
what is offered to you, for the laborer deserves his payment.

Los setenta y dos discípulos regresaron llenos de alegría y le dijeron a Jesús: “Señor, hasta los demonios se nos someten en tu nombre”. Él les contestó: “Vi a Satanás caer del cielo como el rayo. A ustedes les he dado poder para aplastar serpientes y escorpiones y para vencer toda la fuerza del enemigo, y nada les podrá hacer daño. Pero no se alegren de que los demonios se les someten. Alégrense más bien de que sus nombres están escritos en el cielo”.

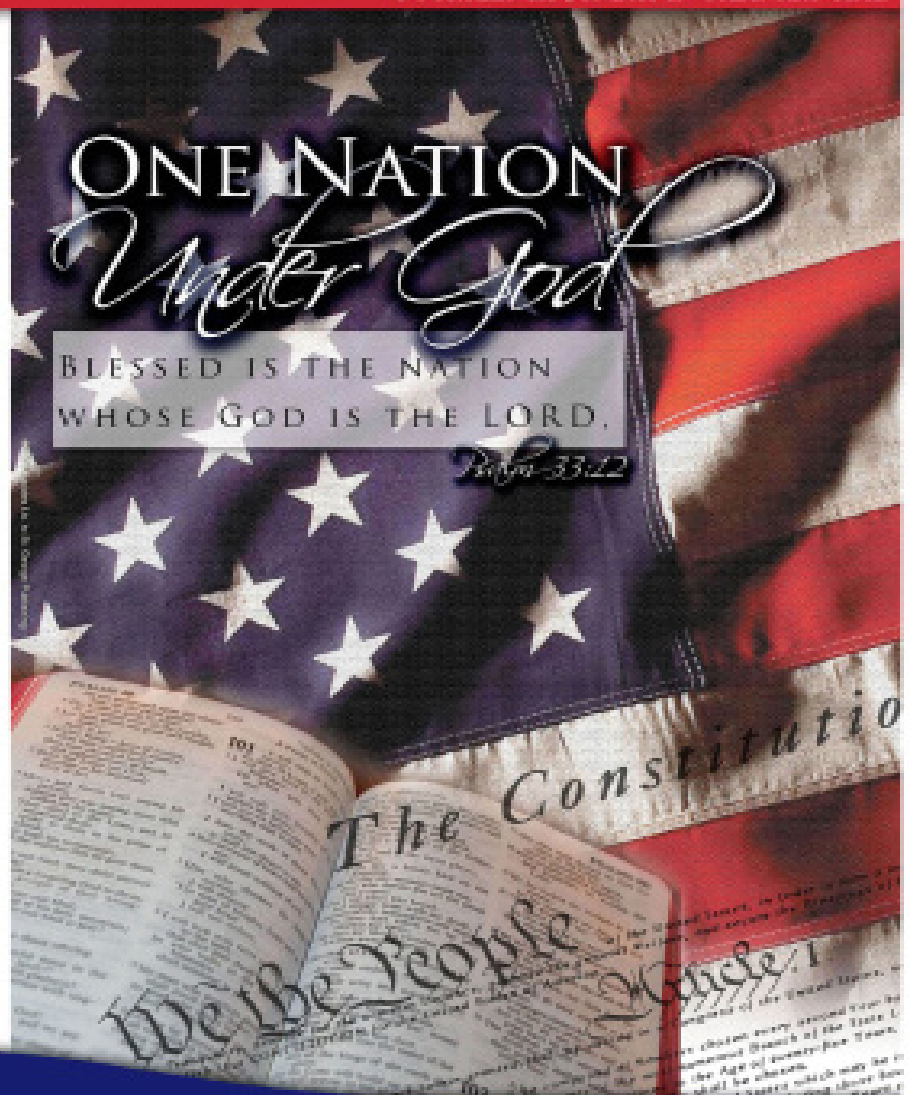
