News from the Wheel-House

“O my God, let me remember with gratitude and confess to thee thy mercies toward me.”

Dear parish family,
Greetings in the name of the Lord!

Last Saturday I had been invited to say the opening prayer for a dance debut of a girl from the Indian Community. The program got delay because of the technical issues. When the technicians were fixing the problems, myself and the families, who had been invited, were waiting at the hall way of the auditorium. At that time, I was talking with one of the Indian families. The family had a small boy. He was twelve years old. I asked him, “how are you? and are you happy?”. Looking at his parents, he replied, “yes I am happy but not completely”. When I asked him, “what do you mean?”. He said, “yes, it is true that my parents have provided me all that I need but not with iPhone 17 which I have been asking them to buy for me these days and they have been saying “no” and because of that I am not happy completely”. I asked him, “at present what model of iPhone he has?”. He said, iPhone 16 Pro Max”. I felt sorry for the wrong attitude of that boy and told him that he would not be completely happy in his life at any point if he would try to be happy based on the material possessions. I added saying that even if his parents were supposed to buy him iPhone 17, he would not be happy because the Apple company would be launching another model in the following year and he would want to have it and the cycle of remaining unhappy would go on. I encouraged the boy to appreciate the love of his parents which helps him to have what he has and stay grateful. I also told him that if he would do it then he would be truly happy. Folks, the reading of this weekend’s talk about the importance of becoming grateful.

Gratitude, Faith and Salvation: This weekend we are celebrating “the Twenty Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time”. Gratitude is an expression of the heart, counting the blessings and acknowledging everything that a person receives. It means learning to live one’s life as if everything were a miracle; Gratitude shifts our focus from what our life lacks to the abundance that is already present. In addition, behavioral and psychological research has shown the surprising life improvements that can stem from the practice of gratitude. Giving thanks makes people happier and more resilient, it strengthens relationships, it improves health, and it reduces stress. The readings of today present the theme of gratitude that should come spontaneously from the heart of every individual. In the Gospel, we have the story of the ten lepers who come to Jesus for healing. Jesus is always present to heal us. Only one of them, a Samaritan healed of leprosy returns to Jesus to praise God and express his gratitude for such grace while the nine others who were healed show no gratitude at all. His expression of gratitude helped him to move to another level of faith and also obtained him the salvation.

In the first reading we hear that Naaman, who got cured of his leprosy miraculously, returned to thank the Prophet Elisha for curing his leprosy, and as a sign of his gratitude, transferred his allegiance to the God of Israel. St. Paul, in the second reading, advises Timothy to be grateful to God even in his physical sufferings and amid the dangers associated with spreading the Word of God because God will always be faithful to His people. Folks in our life we can express our gratitude to our loving and providing God by offering grace before meals and by allotting a few minutes of the day for family prayer. Let us show our gratitude to our forgiving God by forgiving others and by loving God in them, radiating His love, mercy, and compassion to all we encounter, including our families and friends. It is by taking good care of our old and sick parents that we express our gratitude to them for the loving sacrifices they have made in raising us. Thus, let us have an “attitude of gratitude” to God and to our neighbors.

We need to celebrate the Holy Eucharist as the supreme act of thanksgiving: The Greek word “Eucharist” means a profoundly religious and thoroughly spiritual “thanksgiving.” When we celebrate the Holy Mass together, we are thanking God for giving us the great gift of His Son in the Holy Eucharist, both so that we can share His Divine life and so that we can recharge our spiritual batteries. We also thank Him for giving us His teaching, guiding, strengthening Holy Spirit in His One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church. We also express our thanks to God as a parish community by sharing our time, talents, and material blessings in the various ministries and services of the parish and by our active participation in its outreach programs in the community.

Noticias desde la Casa del Timón

Querida familia parroquial:

¡Saludos en el nombre del Señor!

El sábado pasado me invitaron a recitar la oración de apertura del debut de baile de una niña de la comunidad indígena. El programa se retrasó debido a problemas técnicos. Mientras los técnicos solucionaban los problemas, las familias invitadas y yo estábamos esperando en el pasillo del auditorio. En ese momento, estaba hablando con una de las familias indígenas. La familia tenía un niño pequeño de doce años. Le pregunté: “¿Cómo estás? ¿Eres feliz?”. Mirando a sus padres, respondió: “Sí, soy feliz, pero no del todo”. Cuando le pregunté: “¿Qué quieres decir?”, dijo: “Sí, es cierto que mis padres me han dado todo lo que necesito, pero no el iPhone 17, que les he estado pidiendo que me compren estos días y me han dicho que no, y por eso no soy completamente feliz”. Le pregunté: “¿Qué modelo de iPhone tiene actualmente?”. Dijo: iPhone 16 Pro Max. Sentí pena por la actitud equivocada de ese chico y le dije que no sería completamente feliz en su vida en ningún momento si intentaba ser feliz basándose en las posesiones materiales. Añadí que incluso si sus padres le compraran el iPhone 17, no sería feliz porque la compañía Apple lanzaría otro modelo al año siguiente y él querría tenerlo y el ciclo de permanecer infeliz continuaría. Animé al niño a apreciar el amor de sus padres, lo cual le ayuda a tener lo que tiene y a mantenerse agradecido. También le dije que si lo hacía, sería verdaderamente feliz. Amigos, la lectura de este fin de semana habla sobre la importancia de ser agradecidos.

Gratitud, Fe y Salvación: Este fin de semana celebramos el Vigésimo Octavo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. La gratitud es una expresión del corazón: contar las bendiciones y reconocer todo lo que una persona recibe. Significa aprender a vivir la vida como si todo fuera un milagro; la gratitud nos ayuda a enfocarnos en la abundancia que ya tenemos. Además, investigaciones conductuales y psicológicas han demostrado las sorprendentes mejoras en la vida que puede generar la práctica de la gratitud. Dar gracias hace a las personas más felices y resilientes, fortalece las relaciones, mejora la salud y reduce el estrés. Las lecturas de hoy presentan el tema de la gratitud, que debería surgir espontáneamente del corazón de cada persona. En el Evangelio, tenemos la historia de los diez leprosos que acudieron a Jesús en busca de sanación. Jesús siempre está presente para sanarnos. Solo uno de ellos, un samaritano sanado de lepra, regresa a Jesús para alabar a Dios y expresar su gratitud por tal gracia, mientras que los otros nueve sanados no muestran ninguna gratitud. Su expresión de gratitud lo ayudó a alcanzar un nuevo nivel de fe y también le permitió obtener la salvación.

En la primera lectura, escuchamos que Naamán, quien se curó milagrosamente de su lepra, regresó para agradecer al profeta Eliseo por la curación y, como muestra de gratitud, transfirió su lealtad al Dios de Israel. San Pablo, en la segunda lectura, aconseja a Timoteo ser agradecido con Dios incluso en sus sufrimientos físicos y en medio de los peligros asociados con la difusión de la Palabra de Dios, porque Dios siempre será fiel a su pueblo. Amigos, podemos expresar nuestra gratitud a nuestro Dios amoroso y proveedor ofreciendo gracias antes de las comidas y dedicando unos minutos del día a la oración familiar. Demostremos nuestra gratitud a nuestro Dios perdonador perdonando a los demás y amando a Dios en ellos, irradiando su amor, misericordia y compasión a todos con quienes nos encontramos, incluyendo a nuestras familias y amigos. Cuidando bien de nuestros padres ancianos y enfermos, les expresamos nuestra gratitud por los sacrificios amorosos que han hecho para criarnos. Por lo tanto, tengamos una actitud de gratitud hacia Dios y hacia nuestro prójimo. Necesitamos celebrar la Sagrada Eucaristía como el acto supremo de acción de gracias: La palabra griega «Eucaristía» significa una acción de gracias profundamente religiosa y espiritual. Al celebrar juntos la Santa Misa, agradecemos a Dios por darnos el gran don de su Hijo en la Sagrada Eucaristía, tanto para que podamos compartir su vida divina como para recargar nuestras energías espirituales. También le agradecemos por darnos su Espíritu Santo, que nos enseña, guía y fortalece en su Iglesia, una, santa, católica y apostólica.
