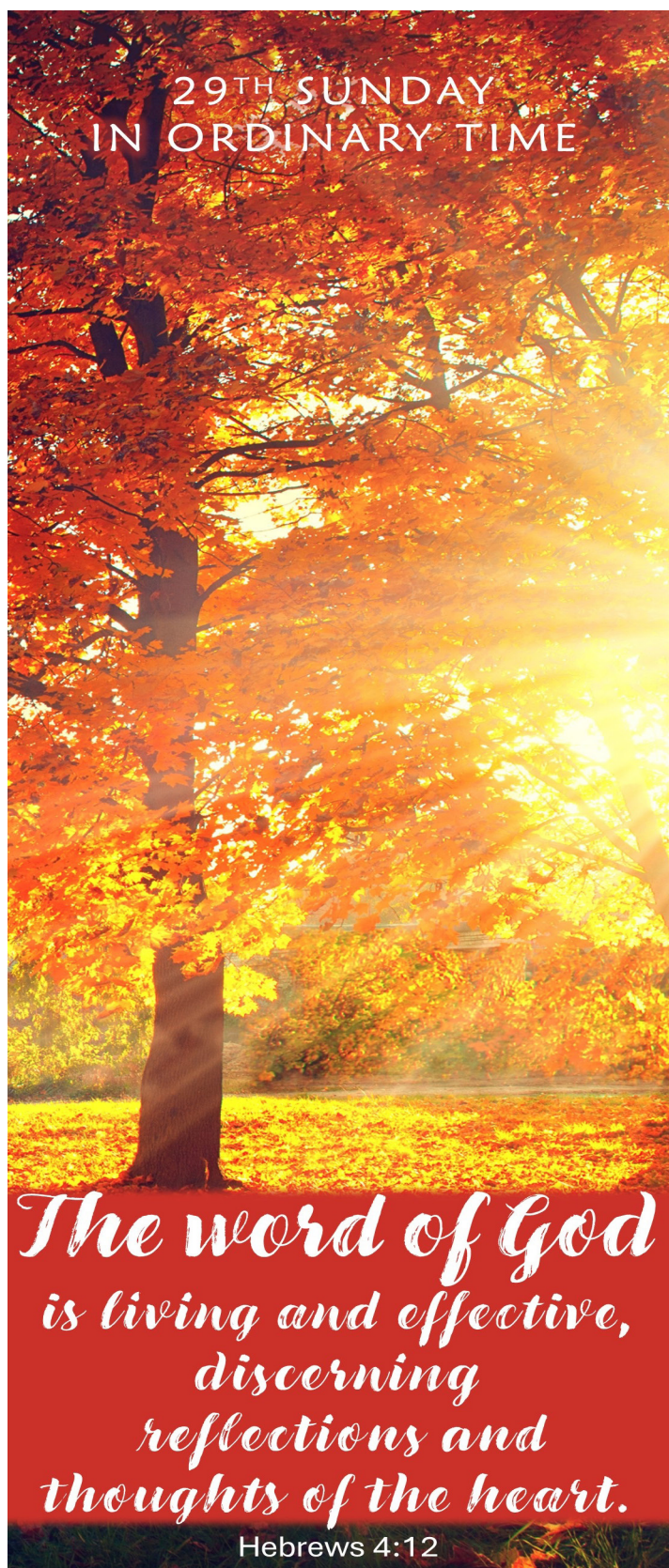

News from the Wheel-House

The waves in life will always find you. What matters most is how you react to those moments and what they teach you. Keep calm while looking at things from different perspectives because sometimes all it takes for change to happen is to look at things in different ways. – Unknown

Dear parish family,

Greetings!

It is true that in our life some things that we read, stay with us for ever and we can recall them even after many years. This thing that I am going to share with you is one kind of that. In 2019 before the Covid 19 Pandemic, Most Rev. Bishop Ivon Ambrosie, the emeritus bishop of Tuticorin Diocese in India visited our parish. He had come over to our parish after visiting the priests of his diocese in Canada. When he was here, I wanted to serve him with the dish that he liked most and so I called to the priest in Canda who had hosted him to know his favorite dish. That priest also gave it to me and I got it and served it which made him so happy. You know, what he liked most? It is fried chicken from KFC. When I went to the KFC place in Lynn, next to Walmart, I couldn't believe the number of people at the place to buy the stuff which made me to get the curiosity to know why many people are crazy about it. I got online and I got to know a beautiful story of a man who was relentless and persevering, who did not allow the waves of his life to get him down. He pushed and pushed until he got what he wanted.

Many of you may know about the story of Mr. Harland "Colonel" Sanders who was born in 1890 and was left to be the man of the house at a young age when his father died, leaving him with a mother and two younger siblings. By the age of 7, he had started cooking and soon after, he was working several odd jobs such as a streetcar conductor, steamboat operator, soldier, fireman, lawyer, and salesman. At the age of 40, he had mastered the perfect fried chicken recipe and had even opened a restaurant to service the high demand for his food. At the age of 60, he had to shut down his restaurant because a highway was being built where his restaurant was located. Colonel Sanders decided to retire, but because he was not content with living off of his \$105 social security checks, he decided to franchise his chicken at the age of 65. He started traveling to different restaurants, cooking his fried chicken on the spot for restaurant owners. If the owner liked the chicken, they would be sold the recipe. However, Colonel Sanders got denied 1,009 times before he made his first sale. By 1964, Colonel Sanders had 600 franchises selling his trademark chicken. At this time, he sold his company for \$2 million dollars but remained as a spokesperson. In 1976, the Colonel was ranked as the world's second most recognizable celebrity. Today, KFC is one of the largest fast-food franchises worldwide. It was because of his perseverance, persistence, relentlessness and never bending down to the exhausting and disheartening waves of his life, he could become successful. Folks, you know after reading this stuff in 2019,

I get to remember this story whenever I come across the gospel passage of this weekend which speaks about a relentless and persevering widow. One skill that is sure to pay off: This weekend we celebrate "the Twenty Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time " and also celebrate "the World Mission Sunday". The readings of this weekend call us to have the persisting nature with our spiritual life and promise us that if we hold it, we will never get disappointed but will be able have the good reward. Both in the first reading and the gospel reading we are presented with the hopeless situations and how, Moses in the first reading and the Widow in the gospel reading, changed them and could get what they wanted. Folks, lot of time we tend to give up when we are battered again and again with disheartening situations and hurdles. Though we all know, nothing comes easy, we lose our hearts and give up. History has lot of stories about the people who could make their lives successful because of their persistence and perseverance. The question that we are asked this weekend is: do we persevere in our faith life when things go wrong, when we are battered again and again or don't get the desired end right away or after a couple of attempts? Bible guarantees us the payoff if we can hold and persevere in faith against all the difficulties, obstacles, hurdles and challenges of our life. As we are encouraged to do this, on this Mission Sunday we are also called to support the mission work done around the world with our prayers and resources in our best capacity. May God bless us all to act on this call and have the promised blessings!

Noticias desde la Casa del Timón

Las olas de la vida siempre te encontrarán. Lo más importante es cómo reaccionas ante esos momentos y qué te enseñan. Mantén la calma al mirar las cosas desde diferentes perspectivas, porque a veces basta con mirarlas de otra manera para que cambien. – Desconocido

Querida familia parroquial:

¡Saludos!

Es cierto que en nuestra vida, algunas cosas que leemos nos acompañan para siempre y podemos recordarlas incluso después de muchos años. Esto que voy a compartir con ustedes es un ejemplo de ello. En 2019, antes de la pandemia de COVID-19, el Reverendísimo Obispo Ivon Ambrosie, obispo emérito de la Diócesis de Tuticorin, India, visitó nuestra parroquia. Había venido después de visitar a los sacerdotes de su diócesis en Canadá. Cuando estuvo aquí, quise servirle el plato que más le gustaba, así que llamé al sacerdote de Canadá que lo había hospedado para saber cuál era su plato favorito. Ese sacerdote también me lo dio, lo recibí y se lo serví, lo cual lo hizo muy feliz. ¿Saben qué le gustaba más? El pollo frito de KFC. Cuando fui al KFC en Lynn, al lado de Walmart, no podía creer la cantidad de gente que había allí para comprarlo, lo que me dio curiosidad por saber por qué a tanta gente le encanta. Me conecté a internet y conocí la hermosa historia de un hombre incansable y perseverante, que no permitió que las olas de la vida lo desanimaran. Continuó insistiendo hasta conseguir lo que quería.

Muchos de ustedes conocen la historia del Sr. Harland “Coronel” Sanders, quien nació en 1890 y desde muy joven se convirtió en el hombre de la casa cuando falleció su padre, dejándolo con su madre y dos hermanos menores. A los 7 años, empezó a cocinar y poco después, realizó varios trabajos ocasionales, como conductor de tranvía, operador de barco de vapor, soldado, bombero, abogado y vendedor. A los 40 años, dominaba la receta perfecta de pollo frito e incluso abrió un restaurante para atender la alta demanda de su comida. A los 60, tuvo que cerrar su restaurante porque se construía una autopista en la zona donde se ubicaba. El Coronel Sanders decidió jubilarse, pero como no le convenía vivir de sus 105 dólares de la seguridad social, a los 65 años decidió franquiciar su pollo. Empezó a viajar a diferentes restaurantes, cocinando su pollo frito al momento para los dueños. Si al dueño le gustaba el pollo, le vendían la receta. Sin embargo, el Coronel Sanders recibió 1009 rechazos antes de concretar su primera venta. Para 1964, el Coronel Sanders contaba con 600 franquicias que vendían su pollo insignia. En ese momento, vendió su empresa por 2 millones de dólares, pero siguió siendo portavoz. En 1976, el Coronel fue clasificado como la segunda celebridad más reconocida del mundo. Hoy, KFC es una de las franquicias de comida rápida más grandes del mundo. Gracias a su perseverancia, persistencia, incansabilidad y a no ceder ante las dificultades y el desaliento de la vida, pudo alcanzar el éxito. Amigos, después de leer esto en 2019,

Recuerdo esta historia cada vez que leo el pasaje del Evangelio de este fin de semana, que habla de una viuda incansable y perseverante. Una habilidad que sin duda dará frutos: este fin de semana celebramos el Vigésimo Noveno Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario y también el Domingo Mundial de las Misiones. Las lecturas de este fin de semana nos llaman a perseverar en nuestra vida espiritual y nos prometen que, si la mantenemos, nunca nos decepcionaremos, sino que recibiremos una buena recompensa. Tanto la primera lectura como el Evangelio nos presentan situaciones desesperadas y cómo Moisés, en la primera lectura, y la viuda, en el Evangelio, las transformaron y lograron lo que querían. Amigos, muchas veces tendemos a rendirnos cuando nos vemos azotados una y otra vez por situaciones y obstáculos desalentadores. Aunque todos sabemos que nada es fácil, nos desanimamos y nos damos por vencidos. La historia está llena de historias sobre personas que lograron el éxito en sus vidas gracias a su persistencia y perseverancia. La pregunta que se nos plantea este fin de semana es: ¿Perseveramos en nuestra vida de fe cuando las cosas van mal, cuando nos golpean una y otra vez o no logramos el fin deseado de inmediato o después de un par de intentos? La Biblia nos garantiza la recompensa si podemos mantenernos y perseverar en la fe ante todas las dificultades, obstáculos, dificultades y desafíos de nuestra vida. Así como se nos anima a hacer esto, en este Domingo de Misiones también estamos llamados a apoyar la obra misionera que se realiza en todo el mundo con nuestras oraciones y recursos, lo mejor que podamos. ¡Que Dios nos bendiga a todos para que cumplamos este llamado y recibamos las bendiciones prometidas!

Exodus 17:8-13

In those days, Amalek came and waged war against Israel. Moses, therefore, said to Joshua, "Pick out certain men, and tomorrow go out and engage Amalek in battle. Today, October 19th, we return to classes for all grades 1 through Confirmation 2. Please remember that classes are from 9:15-10:15.
