Dear parish family,

Last weekend after the Masses many of us made a comment saying that the church was cold and they had to have their jackets on during the Masses. I don't blame them for it was true that the church was cold. My sincere apologies for the inconvenience. You know that this is what happens every year in the month of October as we gradually enter into the season of winter. We get big swing between warm and cold temperatures. And you know we have a big church and to switch between heat and air-conditioning is always a touch and expensive one. We wait until the weather gets stable to turn on the heat. I have already asked our parish business manager Ms. Maryann Giorgio to get in touch with the company which maintains our church heating system to turn on the heat. And so, the things are taken care of, kindly bear with the adjusting time and I truly appreciate it.

Well, now I want to bring to you an awesome and joyful tidings. Yes, it is the news about the announcement made by our Pope Leo XIV. Last Monday our Archdiocese of Boston got the exciting and fabulous news about our Very Reverend Bishop Mark O'Connell, who has been functioning as Vicar General, the second in command at our archdiocese has been appointed as the Bishop of Albany NY. We all know that our loving bishop has been always holding a special place for our parish in his beautiful heart. On June 3, 2016, Pope Francis appointed him as an auxiliary bishop of Boston. He was consecrated on August 24, 2016, at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross by Cardinal Seán O'Malley. As an auxiliary bishop, he was assigned the north region of the archdiocese and appointed pastor of St. Theresa Parish in North Reading, Massachusetts, until December 2022. During that time, he made a lot of visits to our parish to officiate Confirmation Masses, to celebrate Convalidation of Marriages, a couple of meetings, and to help us to get steered during the down time of our parish. He always maintained and still continues to hold a special connection to our parish. I hope that you all remember that he's the one who officiated the Mass, offered his episcopal blessings and installed me as the pastor of St. Anthony's. People, who know him, can certainly acknowledge that he is a man of God, very humble, down to the earth, very caring and kind. Hereby I want to thank and appreciate him for all that he offered to our faith community and myself. I also want to congratulate him as he has been assigned with this new responsibility. Let us keep him in our prayers that God may continue to bless and keep him as a good and blessed shepherd!

Humility A Hallmark of Our Spiritual Life: This weekend we celebrate "the Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time". The central themes of this weekend's readings are the evil of pride, the need for true humility, and the role of God's grace in our salvation.

The first reading, taken from the book of Sirach, is a perfect companion piece to the Gospel parable. It declares "the prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds to reach the unseen throne of God." Such prayers are heard because they come from the hearts of people who know how much they need God. Although God has no favorites and answers the prayers of all, the oppressed, the orphans, the widows, and those who can least help themselves are His special concern. The best prayer is humble and selfless service. The Refrain for today's Responsorial Psalm asks us to hear God's Voice and not to harden our hearts in pride or scorn. In today's Gospel parable about the Pharisee and the tax collector, Jesus reminds us that God hears the prayers of one who approaches Him in humility with a repentant heart. God did not hear the prayer of this Pharisee because he exalted himself. Though he was doing good works, he was full of pride. In his pride he was belittling others. The question to us now is: do I belittle or boo others? The tax collector's prayer, "O God, be merciful to me, a sinner," was heard because he humbled himself, acknowledging his sins and requesting God's mercy. Let us do away with pride and move forward to live the virtue of humility that we may receive the blessings of God.

Ya saben que esto sucede todos los años en el mes de octubre, cuando entramos gradualmente en la temporada de invierno. Tenemos grandes oscilaciones entre temperaturas cálidas y frías. El lunes pasado, nuestra Arquidiócesis de Boston recibió la emocionante y fabulosa noticia de que nuestro Reverendísimo Obispo Mark O'Connell, quien se desempeñaba como Vicario General y segundo al mando en nuestra Arquidiócesis, ha sido nombrado Obispo de Albany, Nueva York. Todos sabemos que nuestro querido obispo siempre ha tenido un lugar especial en su corazón para nuestra parroquia. El 3 de junio de 2016, el Papa Francisco lo nombró obispo auxiliar de Boston. Fue consagrado el 24 de agosto de 2016 en la Catedral de la Santa Cruz por el Cardenal Seán O'Malley. Como obispo auxiliar, fue asignado a la región norte de la arquidiócesis y nombrado párroco de la parroquia Santa Teresa en North Reading, Massachusetts, hasta diciembre de 2022. Durante ese tiempo, visitó nuestra parroquia con frecuencia para oficiar misas de confirmación, celebrar convalidaciones matrimoniales, asistir a un par de reuniones y ayudarnos a encontrar el rumbo durante los periodos de inactividad de nuestra parroquia. Siempre mantuvo, y aún mantiene, una conexión especial con nuestra parroquia. Espero que todos recuerden que fue él quien ofició la misa, ofreció sus bendiciones episcopales y me instaló como párroco de San Antonio. Quienes lo conocen pueden reconocer que es un hombre de Dios, muy humilde, con los pies en la tierra, muy cariñoso y amable. Por la presente, quiero agradecerle y apreciar todo lo que ofreció a nuestra comunidad de fe y a mí. También quiero felicitarlo por haberle sido asignada esta nueva responsabilidad. ¡Manténgalo presente en nuestras oraciones para que Dios continúe bendiciéndolo y conservándolo como un buen pastor!

La humildad, sello distintivo de nuestra vida espiritual: Este fin de semana celebramos el Trigésimo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. Los temas centrales de las lecturas de este fin de semana son el mal del orgullo, la necesidad de la verdadera humildad y el papel de la gracia de Dios en nuestra salvación.

La primera lectura, tomada del libro del Sirácida, es un complemento perfecto para la parábola evangélica. Declara que «la oración del humilde atraviesa las nubes para alcanzar el trono invisible de Dios». Estas oraciones son escuchadas porque provienen del corazón de quienes saben cuánto necesitan a Dios. Aunque Dios no tiene favoritos y responde las oraciones de todos, los oprimidos, los huérfanos, las viudas y los que menos pueden valerse por sí mismos son su preocupación especial. La mejor oración es el servicio humilde y desinteresado. El estribillo del Salmo Responsorial de hoy nos invita a escuchar la voz de Dios y a no endurecer nuestros corazones en el orgullo ni el desprecio. En la parábola del Evangelio de hoy sobre el fariseo y el publicano, Jesús nos recuerda que Dios escucha las oraciones de quien se acerca a Él con humildad y un corazón arrepentido. Dios no escuchó la oración de este fariseo porque se exaltara a sí mismo. Aunque hacía buenas obras, estaba lleno de orgullo. En su orgullo, menospreciaba a los demás. La pregunta para nosotros ahora es: ¿menosprecio o abucheo a los demás? La oración del publicano: «Oh Dios, ten piedad de mí, pecador», fue escuchada porque se humilló, reconoció sus pecados y pidió la misericordia de Dios. Deshagámonos del orgullo y avancemos hacia la virtud de la humildad para recibir las bendiciones de Dios.

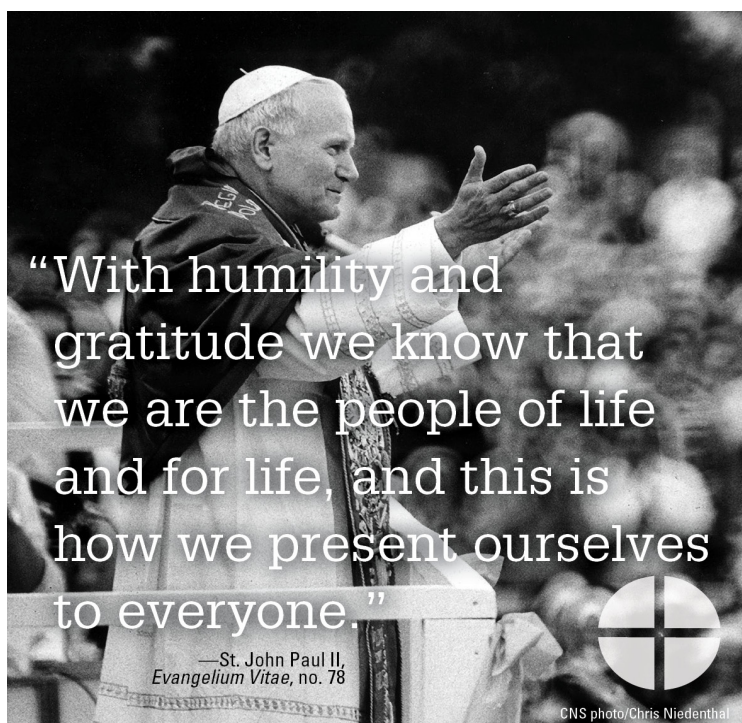

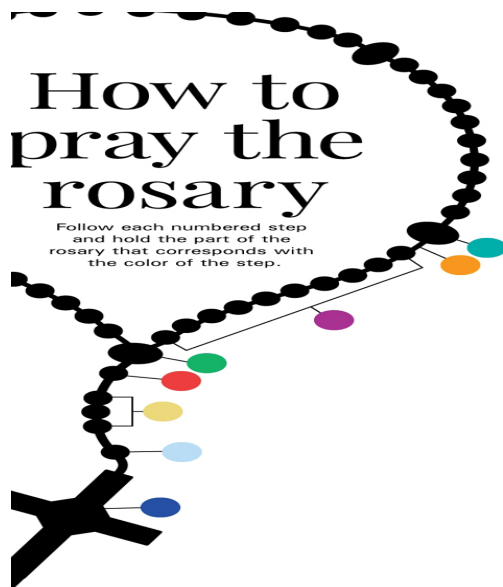
