News from the Wheel-House

Dear parish family,

May God bless all the departed souls with his mercy and help them to have the eternal rest in

Heaven and for us, who are living, may He grant healing and peace!

Your word is a lamp for my feet and light for my path: Here we have stepped into a brand-new month. We always find November a somewhat somber and difficult month. The golden colors of autumn are quickly giving way to the barrenness of winter. As the month progresses, the days will get gradually shorter and darkness will increasingly make its presence felt. We lose the colors of nature and the life-giving quality of light. It is a month we associate with loss. It is perhaps fitting, then, that November is the month when we reflect upon more personal experiences of loss, the loss of significant people in our lives, people who have journeyed with us, who gave us love and whom we loved in return. The commemoration of All Souls is a day when we do that in a special way.

On this day, we feel a sense of communion with our faithful departed. As followers of a risen Lord, we believe that our faithful have not just departed from us but have also returned to God, from whom they came. We understand death as a door through which we pass back to the source of our being, the Creator of all life. We also believe that our loved ones, in passing over into God, do not break their communion with us. Even though they have departed from us, they remain in communion with us and we remain in communion with them. A vital stream of life continues to flow between our deceased loved ones and ourselves. The faith and love that bound us together in this life still binds us to them when they pass over into the next life. In the gospel reading, Jesus gives her son back to the grieving widow. One of the ways we expressed our love and care for our loved ones in this life was by praying for them. Our loved ones who have died can still be touched by the love that finds its voice in prayer. Prayerful remembrance is one of the ways we continue to give expression to our loving communion with them. Such prayer helps them and can also help us. None of us will have had a perfect relationship even with those we have loved the most. When someone close to us dies, there is always some unfinished business. Praying for our loved ones can help to heal whatever may need healing in our relationship with them. As a result, our communion with them can deepen after their death until it comes to fullness at the moment when we too pass over from this life and are united with them in God's love at that great banquet of life.

Although nothing is more painful than the loss of a loved one in death, our faith gives us this hope-filled vision in the face of death.

We hear St Paul saying in his letter to Corinthians that ‘hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given to us’. Our hope is grounded in God's love for us now, a very personal love that is poured into the hearts of each one of us through the Holy Spirit. God's love, revealed in Jesus and poured into our hearts through the Spirit, continues to hold on to us when we pass through the door of death. As all authentic human love is always life-giving for the one loved, God's love is supremely life-giving for us, even in the face of our bodily death. What God's love has already done for us through his Son and the Spirit in this life is the assurance of what God's love will do for us in eternity. In this month, holding ourselves in faith let us offer prayers for all the departed souls, visit their resting places and do charitable works in their name thus so them that we continue to care and love them! Please remember, prayer not only unites us with God but also with our own people both left and living.

Noticias desde la Casa del Timón

Querida familia parroquial:

Tu palabra es una lámpara para mis pies y una luz en mi camino: Hemos entrado en un nuevo mes. Noviembre siempre nos resulta un mes algo sombrío y difícil. Los dorados colores del otoño dan paso rápidamente a la aridez del invierno. Conforme avanza el mes, los días se acortan gradualmente y la oscuridad se hace cada vez más presente. Perdemos los colores de la naturaleza y la luz que da vida. Es un mes que asociamos con la pérdida. Quizás sea apropiado, entonces, que noviembre sea el mes en que reflexionamos sobre experiencias más personales de pérdida: la pérdida de personas significativas en nuestras vidas, personas que nos acompañaron en el camino, que nos brindaron amor y a quienes recibimos a cambio. La conmemoración de los Fieles Difuntos es un día para hacerlo de una manera especial.

En este día, sentimos una profunda comunión con nuestros fieles difuntos. Como seguidores de un Señor resucitado, creemos que nuestros fieles no solo se han alejado de nosotros, sino que también han regresado a Dios, de quien procedían. Entendemos la muerte como una puerta que nos permite volver a la fuente de nuestro ser, el Creador de toda vida. Creemos también que nuestros seres queridos, al pasar a Dios, no rompen su comunión con nosotros. Aunque se hayan alejado de nosotros, permanecen en comunión con nosotros y nosotros con ellos. Un flujo vital de vida continúa fluyendo entre nuestros seres queridos fallecidos y nosotros. La fe y el amor que nos unieron en esta vida aún nos unen a ellos cuando parten a la otra vida. En la lectura del Evangelio, Jesús le devuelve a su hijo a la viuda afligida. Una de las maneras en que expresamos nuestro amor y cuidado por nuestros seres queridos en esta vida fue orando por ellos. Nuestros seres queridos que han fallecido aún pueden ser tocados por el amor que se expresa en la oración. El recuerdo en oración es una de las maneras en que continuamos expresando nuestra amorosa comunión con ellos. Dicha oración los ayuda y también puede ayudarnos a nosotros. Ninguno de nosotros habrá tenido una relación perfecta, ni siquiera con aquellos a quienes más hemos amado. Cuando alguien cercano a nosotros muere, siempre quedan asuntos pendientes. Orar por nuestros seres queridos puede ayudar a sanar lo que necesite sanar en nuestra relación con ellos. Como resultado, nuestra comunión con ellos puede profundizarse después de su muerte hasta alcanzar su plenitud en el momento en que nosotros también partamos de esta vida y nos unamos a ellos en el amor de Dios en ese gran banquete de la vida. Aunque nada es más doloroso que la pérdida de un ser querido por la muerte, nuestra fe nos da esta visión llena de esperanza frente a la muerte.

En su carta a los Corintios, escuchamos a San Pablo decir que «la esperanza no es engañosa, porque el amor de Dios ha sido derramado en nuestros corazones por el Espíritu Santo que nos fue dado». Nuestra esperanza se fundamenta en el amor que Dios nos tiene ahora, un amor muy personal que se derrama en el corazón de cada uno de nosotros a través del Espíritu Santo. El amor de Dios, revelado en Jesús y derramado en nuestros corazones por el Espíritu, continúa aferrándose a nosotros cuando partimos hacia la muerte. Así como todo amor humano auténtico siempre da vida al ser amado, el amor de Dios es, sobre todo, fuente de vida para nosotros, incluso ante la muerte física. Lo que el amor de Dios ya ha hecho por nosotros a través de su Hijo y el Espíritu en esta vida es la garantía de lo que hará por nosotros en la eternidad. En este mes, aferrándonos a la fe, ofrezcamos oraciones por todas las almas de los difuntos, visitemos sus lugares de descanso y hagamos obras de caridad en su nombre, para que así sigamos cuidándolas y amándolas. 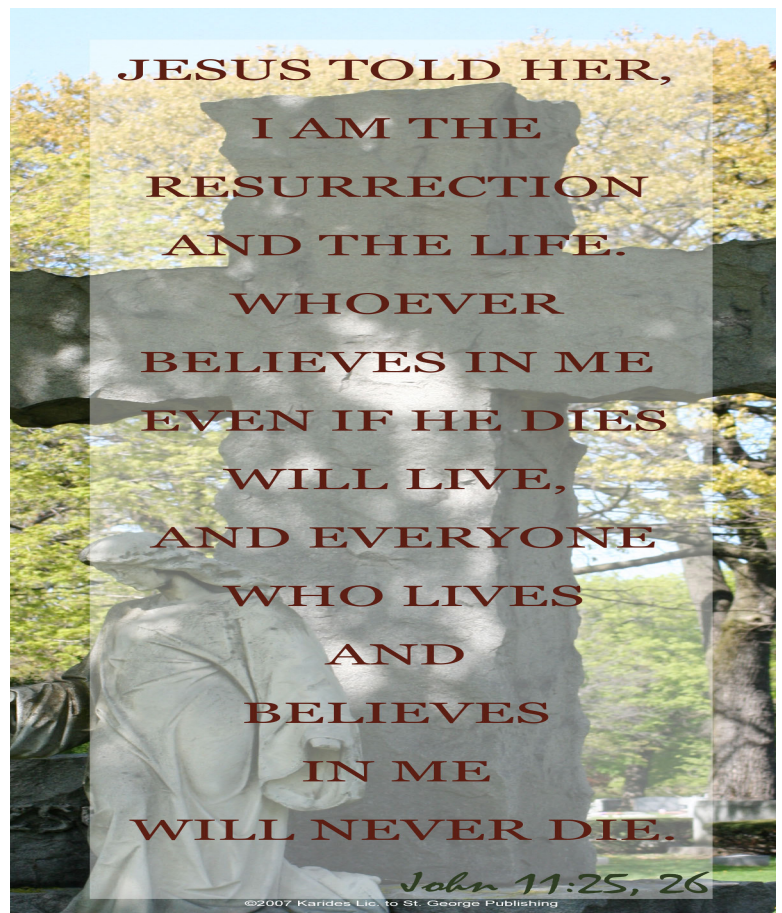
