Dear parish family,

Greetings!

May God, who has blessed us to have our beautiful church St. Anthony's, may also bless us to grow in His love and deeper knowledge of Himself through it!

Folks, last Sunday myself and Fr. Paul had been invited to the 50th Wedding Anniversary Party of one of our long-standing parishioners, Mr. & Mrs. Henry Leno in Peabody MA. After the 12Noon Mass we went to attend it. It was a beautiful one and we had a great time. Fr. George, Fr. Heniston, Deacon Franklin, his wife Wendy and many of our parishioners were also with us. And at one point of the party, one of parishioners came to me and appreciated the thing that happened at 10:30AM Mass of that day. At that Mass, right after the homily I asked the kids presented at the church to get to the sanctuary. Having them lined up at the sanctuary I gave them a few points about the message of the liturgy of the day. Last weekend the church was encouraging the faithful to engage in prayers especially to pray for the deceased people. Folks, praying for the deceased and loved ones is an expression of our love for them as well as of our faith in the life after death. Having done that I took them to “the Remembrance Table”, that we have set up at St. Anthony's shrine side, to show the pictures of all the people who once lived at our parish and have passed away now, and the lit candle light that we have there to remind us that they are in the presence of God. After showing them those things, I made them to say a prayer. Joining me the children said “a Hail Mary...” invoking the blessed mother to bless the souls through her intercession and help them to get to Heaven. That parishioner mentioning it said that I am happy that our children are helped to grow in the love of God and the people. Now you may be wondering why I am talking about the church?

The reason is: folks, every day is an opportunity to achieve new heights on our faith journey. And our church and all the churches in the world serve us as the beautiful places to encourage and inspire us to work on it. Life can be tricky to navigate at times. But we have the Bible, the Sacraments, the churches and great saints of the faith to look to for wisdom and guidance. This weekend's liturgy talks about “the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica”, a church in Rome.

Church is A Place where God's Life-Giving Grace is Given: The readings of today's liturgy call us to realize the importance of coming to the church. The tell us that a church is a house of God and it helps us to become ‘the temple of Christ’. The gospel passage serves as a reminder that the Church and each individual believer are called to be a living temple, free from the impurities of commercialism, greed, and sin. Just as the physical temple needed cleansing, so too do our hearts and souls require constant spiritual work and renewal. A church not only unites us with God but also with our neighbors. The feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica that we celebrate today calls us to move beyond our pettiness and become a part of God's kingdom.

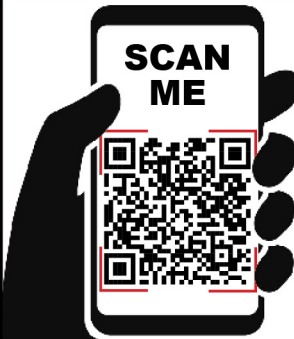
Big Thanks: Last weekend we had a second collection for our parish capital improvements and we collected \$2826.00. Thank you for your generosity.

Querida familia parroquial:

¡Saludos!

Que Dios, quien nos ha bendecido con nuestra hermosa iglesia de San Antonio, nos bendiga también para crecer en su amor y en un conocimiento más profundo de Él a través de ella.

Hermanos, el domingo pasado, el padre Paul y yo fuimos invitados a la fiesta del 50.º aniversario de bodas de uno de nuestros feligreses más antiguos, el Sr. y la Sra. Henry Leno, en Peabody, Massachusetts. Después de la misa del mediodía, fuimos a la celebración. Fue una fiesta preciosa y lo pasamos de maravilla. El padre George, el padre Heniston, el diácono Franklin, su esposa Wendy y muchos de nuestros feligreses también nos acompañaron. En un momento de la fiesta, un feligrés se acercó a mí y me comentó lo que había sucedido en la misa de las 10:30 de la mañana de ese día. En esa misa, justo después de la homilía, les pedí a los niños que estaban en la iglesia que fueran al santuario. Una vez formados allí, les expliqué brevemente el mensaje de la liturgia. El fin de semana anterior, la iglesia había animado a los fieles a rezar, especialmente por los difuntos. Orar por los difuntos y seres queridos es una expresión de nuestro amor por ellos y de nuestra fe en la vida después de la muerte. Después, los llevé a la Mesa de la Memoria, que tenemos junto al santuario de San Antonio, para mostrarles las fotos de todos los feligreses que han fallecido y la luz de las velas que nos recuerda que están en la presencia de Dios. Tras mostrarles todo esto, les pedí que rezaran. Los niños se unieron a mí y rezaron un Ave María, invocando a la Santísima Virgen para que, por su intercesión, bendijera las almas y las ayudara a llegar al Cielo. El feligrés que lo mencionó dijo que me alegra que nuestros hijos crezcan en el amor a Dios y al prójimo. Quizás se pregunten por qué hablo de la iglesia.

La razón es que, cada día es una oportunidad para avanzar en nuestra fe. Nuestra iglesia, al igual que todas las iglesias del mundo, nos ofrece hermosos lugares que nos animan e inspiran a seguir adelante. La vida a veces puede ser difícil, pero contamos con la Biblia, los Sacramentos, las iglesias y los grandes santos de la fe para encontrar sabiduría y guía. La liturgia de este fin de semana conmemora la Dedicación de la Basílica de Letrán, en Roma.

La iglesia es un lugar donde se recibe la gracia vivificante de Dios: Las lecturas de la liturgia de hoy nos llaman a comprender la importancia de acudir a la iglesia.
