Culinary Camp Behavior Policy

To ensure a safe, respectful, and fun environment for everyone, all campers are expected to follow these behavior guidelines:

Respect

- Treat fellow campers, staff, and volunteers with kindness and courtesy.
- Respect all personal space, property, and the camp environment.

Responsibility

- Follow instructions the first time they are given.
- Stay with your group and participate fully in activities.
- Keep hands, feet, and objects to yourself.

Safety

- Use equipment as instructed.
- Practice good hygiene, especially during food prep.
- Report any accidents or concerns to a camp leader immediately.

Kindness

- Encourage one another and help others when needed.
- Use appropriate language and behavior at all times.
- Include others in games and activities.

Tell and Adult

- If someone is bothering your child, please encourage them to speak to an adult right away.
- We can only address issues if we know about them. Open and honest communication helps us create a safe and respectful environment for everyone.

Disciplinary Process

If a camper struggles to meet behavior expectations:

- They will receive a verbal reminder.
- Continued issues may result in a conversation with a parent or guardian.
- Serious or repeated behavior may lead to early pickup or dismissal from the camp.
