## Meeting Minutes for Thursday, October 2, 2025

- Call to Order: Worthy Deputy Grand Knight, Jeff Beck
  - The Business Meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm.

  - o Our Yearly Calendar for activities is being updated and will be sent out.
  - The Comedy Show has sold 275 tickets. The committee meets every month. They will set up a row of chairs after tonight's meeting to plan the layout for the show. Our goal is to possibly have 350 seats.
  - o Food Table Last month the Food Table collected \$50.00 for the Sarnelli House.
  - o RICA (Sam) There are 29 in the program this year. Some may need a Spiritual Sponsor.

## • Family Director – Terry Quain

- Project Outreach In Chester County, one in ten people live with food insecurity. The SNAP program was part of the budget cuts. Project Outreach now helps 80 families per week due to the cost of groceries putting a strain on their budgets.
- Food for Families (Charlie George) During the Car Show, 50 lbs. of food and some money was collected. Continue to bring food to the meetings.

## • Community Director (Art)

- Mass Transit (Phil McGavin) We have a new client, who lives in Pottstown, to bring to church. We have 2 men (one/week) who volunteered and we need two more. If you live in the Pottstown area, let Phil know that you can help.
- St. Mary's Franciscan Shelter (Dave) We are the 4th Saturday of every month. A reminder that the Health Department has stated that the meal must be an already cooked meal from a local licensed restaurant or pizza shop, that is, near the Shelter in Phoenixville that delivers from Knights to Shelter. Place order 2 days in advance, i.e. Dantes Italian Bistro.
  - The 2026 schedule will be out soon. See weekly e-mails.
- o <u>Food Table</u> (Art) T.Y. Andy who brought tonight's food. We need a volunteer for December and for next year. The Collection Basket will be for "Food for Families."
- Sarnelli House (Jeff Beck) Food was delivered on Sat., 09/20, 36 casseroles. They are extremely appreciative. They need clothing donations: coats, blankets, hoodies, men's pants (used O.K.), and new socks and underwear (Med. or Large only). On Dec. 18, they need a Santa to give out gifts and volunteers to serve food.
- o Football Mania (John Russo) We made over \$900.00 for our Council.
- Backpacks for Kids (Frank Louis) 75 kids received backpacks (40 from Pottstown), also: Helping Hands, Daily Bread, and STC PREP students.
- <u>Coats for Kids</u> (Jim Banks) The lower parking lot here at STC will be the drop-off point. For 3 days, we will need volunteers to distribute the 96 cases to other councils. Look for the email.
- Council Swag (Art) October 15 is the last day to place an order at Lucky Squirrel. With each purchase, \$2.50 comes back to our Council. We will investigate a Pop-up Tent (K. of C. canopy) for outdoor events as a sign-up booth for new members, such as, high school football games.
- o Communications (John Russo) We have updated our e-mail list for the weekly email.
- Respect Life Sunday Weekend of October 4 5. Collections after all Masses for our Pro-Life Program. Let your wife know, Birthright is looking for women to volunteer.
- March for Life We had to cancel our bus due to low sign-ups and we got our money back. We joined "Berks County Pro-Lifers," marched around the Capital in Harrisburg, attended Mass at the Basilica, had lunch, and returned.
- <u>Car Show</u> (Dennis Wright / Jim Bozzini) We had 116 cars and the best turnout yet. The event made about \$2,202.00. Those who came out to volunteer and set up were acknowledged.
- <u>Grill Cleaned</u> Steve cleaned (Power washed) the grill used at the festival.
- St. Padre Pio Center The habit of St. Padre Pio will be on display Mon., 10/13 and Tues., 10/14.
