

A NOTE FROM FR. TOM

Psalm 51:3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 17

R: (cf. 3a) Be merciful, O Lord, for we have sinned.

Have mercy on me, O God, in you goodness; in the greatness of you compassion wipe out my offense. Thoroughly wash me from my guilt and of my sin cleanse me. R

For I acknowledge my offense, and my sin is always before me. "Against you only have I sinned, and done what is evil in your sight." R

A clean heart create for me, O God, and a steadfast spirit renew within me. Cast me not out from your presence, and your Holy Spirit take not from me. R

Give me back the joy of your salvation, and a willing spirit sustain in me. O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will proclaim your praise. R

The Responsorial Psalm for the First Sunday of Lent is the most famous penitential psalm in the Book of Psalms. Psalm 51 is recited every Friday throughout the year by priests, deacons, religious, and laity during Morning Prayer of the Liturgy of the Hours.

Tradition holds that King David wrote this psalm after his sins involving Bathsheba, in which David fell to the same pattern of temptation first experienced in the Garden of Eden. In the First Reading from the Book of Genesis, Eve gives in to the threefold concupiscence of (1) lust of the flesh, (2) lust of the eyes, and (3) pride of life when she sees that the forbidden fruit was (1) good for food, (2) pleasing to the eyes, and (3) desirable for gaining wisdom. King David falls to the threefold concupiscence when he (2) desires from afar to possess another man's wife for her beauty, (1) commits adultery with her, and (3) pridefully refuses to admit his wrongdoing, committing murder to cover his tracks.

Although he falls to the same threefold concupiscence as Adam and Eve, David repents with great contrition. In this psalm, David prays for a clean heart and a renewed spirit, the anticipation of the cleansing of our hearts in the sacraments of baptism and confession. David confesses his sin to God and prays to be washed clean of his guilt. Christ instituted the sacraments as vehicles to receive God's grace. David did not have access to the sacrament of confession, but we do. This Lent, make use of the sacrament of confession to receive God's grace and to be cleansed of guilt and sin.

R: That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.



LENTEN REGULATIONS FOR FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence from meat. Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence.

Fasting is to be observed by all faithful who are at least 18 years of age, but have not yet reached 59. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each person's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but drinking liquids, including milk and juices, is allowed. Food necessary for the taking of medicine is permitted.

Abstinence is observed by all persons 14 years of age or older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, however, Church law does not require abstinence.

In addition to those excused because of age, also excused from fasting and abstinence are those with physical or mental illness, including those suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Women who are pregnant or nursing are also excused. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and persons with illnesses should not jeopardize their health by fasting. When in doubt concerning fasting or abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.


Saint Casimir

orn in Krakow, Casimir was the son of Casimir IV, king of Poland and grand duke of Lithuania, and Elizabeth of Austria. From a young age, he was concerned with the integrity and justice of his father's rule. He worked to ensure the fair treatment and aid of the poor and less fortunate. He was called the Patron of the Poor because of his love for others and charitable works. Casimir was known to be a humble and approachable man, traits that were not always synonymous with rulers at the time.

Known for his refusal to take up arms, personal piety, generosity to the poor and devotion to the Blessed Mother, he rejected the idea of marrying in favor of voluntary chastity. During a visit to Lithuania, he fell ill, died from tuberculosis at the age of 25 and was buried in the cathedral in Vilnius. Canonized in 1521, he is the patron of Poland and Lithuania.




