

A NOTE FROM FR. TOM

Psalm 22:8-9, 17-18, 19-20, 23-24

R: (2a) My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?

All who see me scoff at me;

they mock me with parted lips, they wag their heads:

"He relied on the LORD; let him deliver him,

Let him rescue him, if he loves him. R

Indeed, many dogs surround me, a pack of evildoers closes in upon me; They have pierced my hands and my feet; I can count all my bones. R

They divide my garments among them, and for my vesture they cast lots.

But you, O LORD, be not far from me;

O my help, hasten to aid me. R

I will proclaim your name to my brethren; in the midst of the assembly I will praise you: "You who fear the LORD, praise him; all you descendants of Jacob, give glory to him; revere him, all you descendants of Israel! R

The Responsorial Psalm for today, Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, is perhaps the most dramatic of all the psalms, and it has always been understood by Christians as a prophesy of Christ's Passion. The writer of Psalm 22 is traditionally thought to be King David, who wrote about half of all the psalms. While David did not suffer the trials of this psalm literally, Christ did. David suffered these torments figuratively, but the literal fulfilment of the psalm is found in Jesus' Passion.

At the time of Jesus, the psalms did not have the numbering system they have today, but were known by their first verse. When Jesus cries, "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?" from the Cross, he does not feel utterly abandoned and separated from the Father. Rather, he is citing the psalm by how it was known—the first verse—and inviting bystanders to interpret what is happening to him in light of the entire psalm, which is in the throes of its literal fulfillment.

Our Responsorial Psalm is only a segment of the full psalm. I encourage you to bring all of Psalm 22 to prayer with you during this holiest week of the year as you participate in all the liturgies of Holy Week and the Easter Triduum. Jesus knew how the psalm concludes, and he invites us—the bystanders to his Passion—to see the psalm he cites on the Cross through to its conclusion. Although Jesus was in agony on the Cross as he cited Psalm 22, he also knew the Cross was the path to his triumph over our sin and death. I encourage you to experience your own salvation through the liturgies of the Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil on Saturday.

LENTEN REGULATIONS FOR FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence from meat. Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence.

Fasting is to be observed by all faithful who are at least 18 years of age, but have not yet reached 59. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each person's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but drinking liquids, including milk and juices, is allowed. Food necessary for the taking of medicine is permitted.

Abstinence is observed by all persons 14 years of age or older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, however, Church law does not require abstinence.

In addition to those excused because of age, also excused from fasting and abstinence are those with physical or mental illness, including those suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Women who are pregnant or nursing are also excused. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and persons with illnesses should not jeopardize their health by fasting. When in doubt concerning fasting or abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.



April is dedicated to The Holy Spirit

We find ourselves on the threshold of the Paschal events. The new, definitive revelation of the Holy Spirit as a Person who is the gift is accomplished at this precise moment. The Paschal events—the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ—are also the time of the new coming of the Holy Spirit, as the Paraclete and the Spirit of truth. They are the time of the "new beginning" of the self-communication of the Triune God to humanity in the Holy Spirit through the work of Christ the Redeemer. This new beginning is the Redemption of the world: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son." Already the "giving" of the Son, the gift of the Son, expresses the most profound essence of God who, as Love, is the inexhaustible source of the giving of gifts. The gift made by the Son completes the revelation and giving of the eternal love: the Holy Spirit, who in the inscrutable depths of the divinity is a Person-Gift, through the work of the Son, that is to say by means of the Paschal Mystery, is given to the Apostles and to the Church in a new way, and through them is given to humanity and the whole world.




