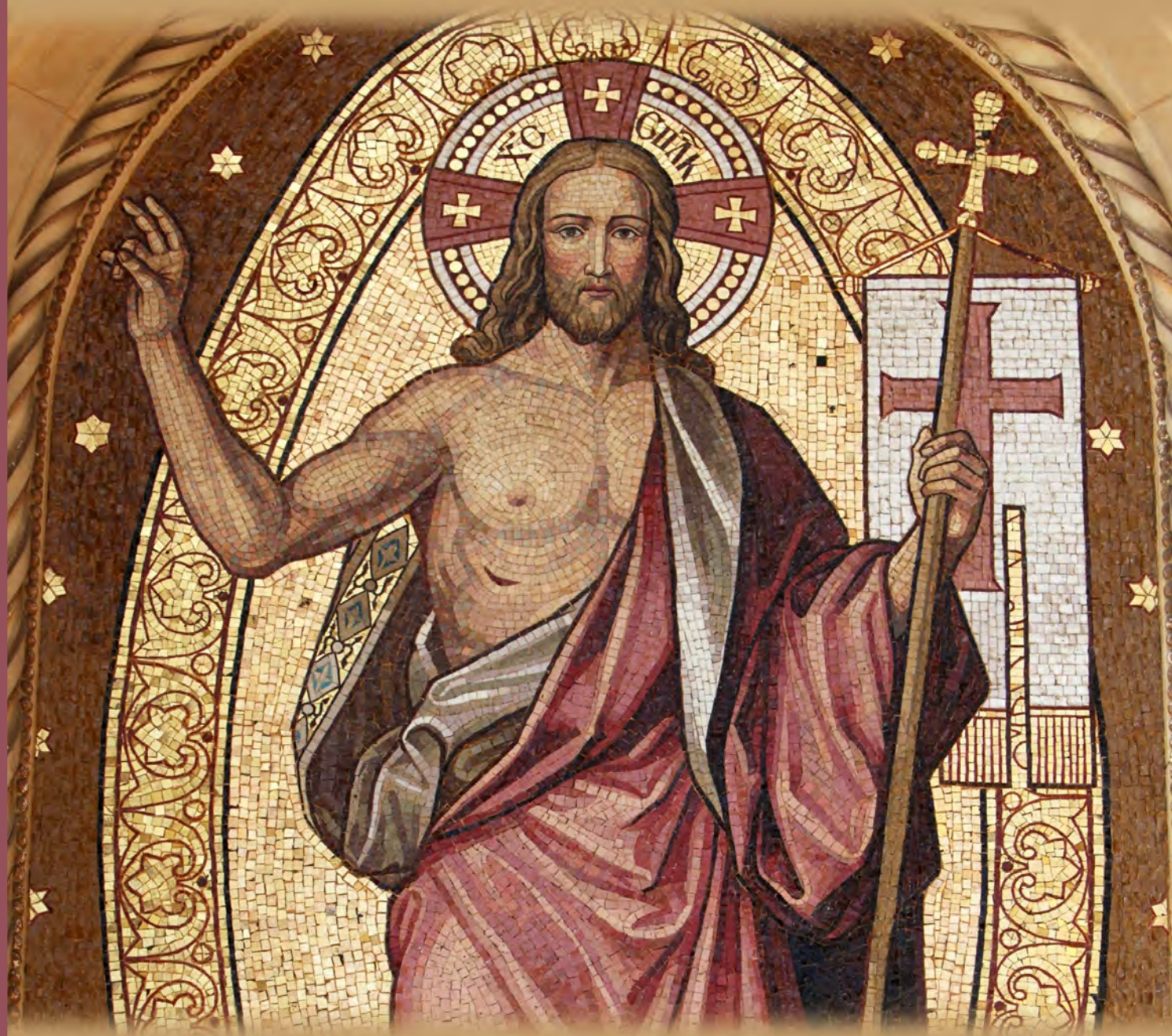


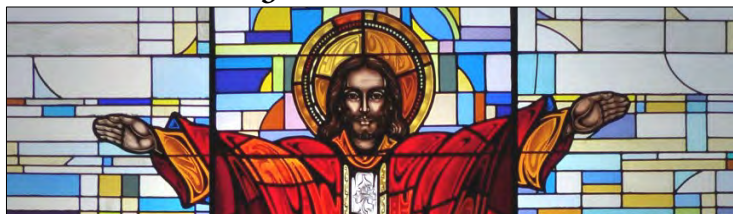

Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23

R: (24) This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.
or:

R: Alleluia.

Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good,
for his mercy endures forever.

Let the house of Israel say,
"His mercy endures forever." **R**

"The right hand of the LORD has struck with power;
the right hand of the LORD is exalted.
I shall not die, but live,

The stone which the builders rejected
has become the cornerstone.

By the LORD has this been done;
it is wonderful in our eyes. **R**

The psalms of the Triduum encapsulate the dramatic rhythm of highs and lows of Holy Week. Having celebrated the institution of both the Eucharist and the priesthood at the Last Supper on Holy Thursday: *The cup of salvation I will take up, / and I will call upon the name of the LORD* (Psalm 116:13); commemorated the Lord's suffering, death, and burial on Good Friday: *Into your hands I commend my spirit; / you will redeem me, O LORD, O faithful God* (Psalm 31:5); and grieved the absence of the Lord on Holy Saturday, we now celebrate with great joy the Resurrection of Jesus on Easter Sunday.

Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, / for his mercy endures forever. This first verse of the Responsorial Psalm for Easter could be called the theme for the whole Book of Psalms, which is a book of praise in thanksgiving for God's fidelity to the covenant he made with his Chosen People, Israel. The psalm is so appropriate as our Easter psalm because at the Last Supper on Holy Thursday God made a new covenant with his people through the Blood of his Son, and he has shown his fidelity to his covenant most powerfully by raising Jesus from the dead on Easter Sunday.

Psalm 118 is a *Todah* psalm, a psalm of praise and thanksgiving that corresponds to the *Todah* sacrifice in the temple. A *Todah* sacrifice was not offered like other sacrifices in reparation for sin, but offered in thanksgiving for a saving act the Lord had done for the worshiper. Keeping a vow made to God in time of distress, the *Todah* sacrifice was offered to God in thanksgiving for being saved. The *Todah* festival then followed, in which family and friends would celebrate by partaking of the meat and bread of the sacrifice, and giving public testimony of God's saving power to all gathered in the Temple.

How appropriate this *Todah* psalm is for Easter, as we give thanks and praise to God for his ultimate saving act: the Life, Death, and Resurrection of his Son. I wish you and your loved ones a blessed Easter filled with joy. Indeed, *this is the day the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad.*

The Prince of life, who died, reigns immortal.

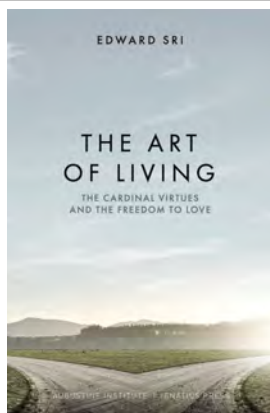
Speak, Mary, declaring

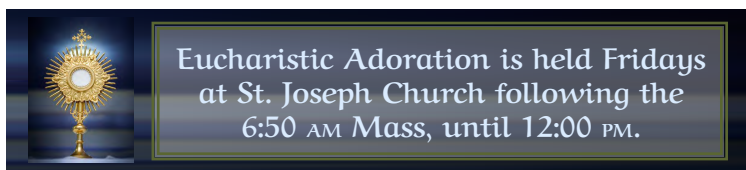

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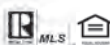
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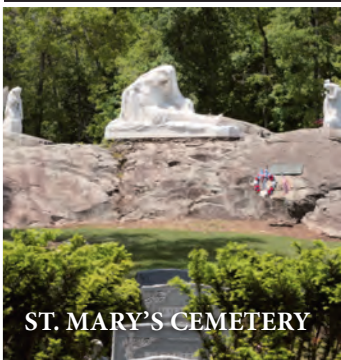


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ST. MARY'S CEMETERY
