- Sunday 11:00am A more formal Mass with an adult choir
- Sunday 5:00pm A contemporary Mass with a worship band

Additionally, St. Joseph has a vibrant parish community with an active Social Justice ministry, an evening Men's Group with speakers, and plans to start a Youth Ministry program.
