

St. Patrick Church Sesquicentennial Celebration Recap



In the Summer of 2024 while going through items belonging to her deceased mother, a parishioner of Sacred Hearts/St. Patrick came across a booklet that had been published in 1924 in commemoration of St. Patrick Church's 50th Anniversary of its founding in 1874. The booklet was a wealth of information on both the history of St. Patrick Church and how the occasion was celebrated.

When Fr. John Delaney, Pastor, saw this document, he realized that in November of 2024 St. Patrick Church would celebrate its 150th Anniversary, or *Sesquicentennial Celebration*. With little time to prepare for the big event, Fr. John appointed a 150th Anniversary Committee to help him plan for the year-long celebration, and in September of 2024 the committee began meeting and planning.

First up was the hanging of a banner across the front of St. Patrick's announcing the celebration, followed by the first event, a Mass celebrated by Pastor John Delaney, assisted by Deacon Gil Sullivan on Sunday November 17th, just two days after the actual November 15th date of the first Mass celebrated in 1874 in the newly constructed church. The Mass was well attended by a joyful crowd, the Knights of Columbus were represented, the music was chosen from hymns written or familiar in the 19th century, and a festive breakfast followed in the downstairs hall. Prayer cards of St. Patrick and note cards with a hand-sketched image of the church were provided for all those attending. Within the Sacred Hearts Parish weekly bulletin on November 17th, parishioners could read the first of a series of eight once-monthly installments of a *History of Saint Patrick Church* chronicling the path that led to the present.

After a pause for the Christmas season, the 150th Celebration continued on January 5th, 2025 with a Holy Hour led by Deacon Gil Sullivan after the 10:15 Mass. The Holy Hour included Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, prayer, quiet time for reflection, and concluded with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

The feast of Saint Patrick of Ireland was a highlight of the 150th Celebration. The festivities began on Sunday, March 16, 2025 at 10:15 am Mass with Bishop Robert Hennessey presiding, Fr. John Delaney concelebrating, and Deacon Brian Daley assisting. Following Mass, a pancake breakfast in the lower hall was enjoyed by all, with both events very well attended. Deacon Brian Daley was a seminarian and transitional deacon from St. John's Seminary in Brighton, Mass. who fulfilled his required parish work at Sacred Hearts Parish during the two years previous to his Ordination to the Priesthood on May 17, 2025.

On Monday March 17th, a noon-time Mass to honor the patron of Ireland and of St. Patrick Church was celebrated by Fr. Delaney with Fr. Dan McCoy concelebrating. After Mass the attendees were treated to Irish Soda Bread baked by members of the Catholic Daughters and served with authentic Kerrygold butter. Photos of events from St. Patrick Church's past were displayed in the vestibule of the Church to recall those many memories.

In observance of the season of Lent, on Saturday April 5th, 2025, from noon to 3 pm, the 150th Celebration Committee presented a Lenten Retreat, *Sacred Silence*, focusing on the treasures of the Catholic faith contained in the symbolism adorning the stained-glass windows of St. Patrick's. Members of the 150th Committee gave presentations on the windows, explaining the meaning of the images and their relation to our Catholic faith. Moments of silence followed each presentation to allow those present some time for reflection. Midway through the retreat, attendees were offered refreshments and the opportunity to make their own paper-craft version of a stained-glass window to take home as a reminder of the day. The retreat concluded with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction led by Deacon Gil Sullivan.

With the arrival of the Easter Season, an *Easter Season Evening of Song & Prayer* led by Scott Ness, Peg DiGrazia, and Ben and Elizabeth Woodard was offered on Tuesday, May 6th, 7 pm at St. Patrick Church. Those in attendance were treated to joyous uplifting music befitting the holy season of Easter. The beautiful musical selections served primarily to give glory and honor to God, but also served to remind us of the many talents possessed by those in our combined church community who help enrich our worship experiences.

Celebration of the 150th Anniversary of the founding of St. Patrick Church formally concluded on June 15, 2025, with a combined Fathers' Day and Sesquicentennial light lunch with cake at 11:30 am. The 150th Anniversary/ Sesquicentennial Committee thanks all those who in any way participated in the celebration and in creating many more memories to be added to the History of St. Patrick Church.



Did You Know?

Did you know that in the United States the Catholic Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as the Feast of Corpus Christi, on the second Sunday after Pentecost? This year the feast is observed on June 22nd. The Church teaches us that when we receive the Eucharist we are receiving the actual body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ. While the bread and wine of Communion retain their appearances, we believe that through the priest's words of consecration, Christ becomes truly present for us to receive. This belief is based on Christ's own words at the Last Supper, when he instituted this divine sacrament: "This is my body, which will be given for you..." (Lk. 22:19) and "...for this is my blood of the covenant..." (Mt. 26:28) Accordingly, the Second Vatican Council in its document Lumen *Gentium* declared the Eucharist to be the "source and summit of the Christian life...For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself..." With worthy reception of Holy Communion we partake of this most wonderful gift Jesus has left with us in order that he may be always present to us.






