

Dear Sacred Hearts Family,

This weekend's readings are full of joy, hope, and mission. How fitting as we recently wrapped up a beautiful and faith-filled week at our SCUBA Vacation Bible School (VBS)!

In the first reading, the prophet **Isaiah** (66:10–14c) invites the people to rejoice with Jerusalem, promising God's comfort and peace. "As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you," the Lord says. That image of God's tender love was truly alive in our parish during VBS camp, as we welcomed **50 campers and 18 teen mentors** into a week of diving deep into friendship with God. Through prayer, play, crafts, songs, and smiles, our children experienced the gentle, joyful comfort of a God who delights in them.

In our second reading, **St. Paul writes to the Galatians (6:14–18)**, reminding us that our only boast is in the cross of Jesus Christ. Paul speaks of being a new creation—transformed by grace. That transformation was beautifully visible in our teen mentors and volunteers, who gave generously of their time and hearts to help our youngest disciples encounter God's love. It was a powerful witness to what it means to live in the Spirit.

And finally, in today's **Gospel (Luke 10:1–12, 17–20)**, Jesus sends out the seventy-two to proclaim peace and the nearness of God's Kingdom. How perfect for us to hear this call after such a mission-filled week! Just like those first disciples, our VBS campers were sent out each day to learn, share, and live the Good News. They discovered that **God is real, loving, trustworthy, forever, and a friend for everyone. (Thanks, God!)**

During our SCUBA VBS week, our parish truly became a place of joy, mission, and deep friendship with God. Thank you to everyone who supported VBS through your prayers, time, donations, and encouragement. You helped plant seeds of faith that will grow for years to come.

Let us carry the joy and peace of this week into the world, knowing that wherever we go, God walks with us—and His Kingdom is near.

Did You Know?

Did you know that on July 11th the Church celebrates the feast of Saint Benedict, the Father of Western Monasticism? Benedict was born c. 480 in Nursia (in present-day Italy), the son of a Roman noble; and a tradition holds that his twin sister was to become Saint Scholastica. In his early manhood Benedict chose to forsake wealth and noble position to serve only God. Withdrawing from what he viewed as a troubled and immoral world, he lived as a hermit in a mountain cave, but later went on to found the famous monastery of Monte Cassino. Over time he wrote The Rule of Saint Benedict, prescribing a moderate asceticism which became the norm for all Western Monasticism during the Middle Ages, emphasizing the practices of obedience, manual labor, spiritual reading, as well as private and communal prayer. The treasure of monasticism has been a vibrant part of our Church for over 1500 years due in great part to the holy work and life of Saint Benedict!


SEEKING LITURGICAL MINISTERS


