

A REFLECTION ON THE PARABLE OF THE GOOD SAMARITAN: UNCLE FRANKIE AND THE BOYS ON THE BEACH

It was during the summer of 1969 that I -- skinny and scrawny, just shy of seventeen -- became one of the boys on the beach. I had started dating Diana that spring, and soon learned that one of her family's time-honored traditions was to gather at Hampton Beach State Park every summer Sunday for a day of sun, surf and sand. And so it was that one Sunday in early June, I made my first appearance. There were about twenty people there that day: Diana's mother, her aunt Mary, her cousin Marie as well as various and sundry family members and friends. And, of course, Uncle Frankie.

Every beach day followed a fairly predictable pattern. After an hour spent in bumper-to-bumper traffic angrily swatting green heads, we would finally arrive at the state reservation. Coffee and donuts would await us, before we youngsters would head off for a few hours on the beach. We'd fly kites until they got tangled, freeze ourselves until the waters got too icy and slip and slide our way along the jetty. By then, it was time for lunch.

And what a lunch it was! Hot and sweet sausages, sizzling steaks, pasta with sauce and meatballs, and corn on the cob dripping with melted butter. Cookies, ice cream and cantaloupe made for a delicious desert! The beer was always plentiful and always plenty cold.

After lunch, the boys would usually play bocce. Sometimes we'd form teams among ourselves; sometimes we'd be challenged by a nearby pack of picnickers. For dinner we'd finish the leftovers, polish off the donuts, cookies and fruit and pack up our paraphernalia. The last rays of the setting sun would find us – these boys and girls of summer – sunburnt, satisfied and headed for home. As I look back now, it seems that every summer Sunday then was sunny and the seasons sandwiched between spring and fall were endless. Those days are now times to be treasured, even as they recede, like the tides, into the mists of my memory.

Exactly a quarter of a century earlier, Uncle Frankie could be found with quite a different group of boys on quite a different beach. On a day in early June of 1944, he – and they – took part in the Normandy invasion on D –Day. I can picture Frankie now, skinny and scrawny, just shy of twenty, wading through the waist-deep icy waters as he struggled to gain the shore where still more horrors awaited him. One can only imagine what Frank must have seen that day as all around him and his fellow boys on the beach the withering fire of Nazi machine guns tore through their ranks, raining down a hellfire of death and destruction. Yet, as twilight drew its dusky shroud upon the bloody shore that evening, it would show that these soldiers – part of The Greatest Generation – had gained a tiny toehold on the beach. This toehold would – in time – become a stranglehold. D-Day would prove to be the beginning of the end for the Third Reich and its deranged dictator.

Did You Know?

Did you know the **Sign of the Cross** is the shortest creed, or statement of belief, that we use? When we trace the cross on our bodies, we are professing our belief in God as the Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Catholics traditionally begin and end prayer with the Sign of the Cross. We experience this at Mass where the celebrant begins by leading us in this sign, and then at the end of Mass, as we make the sign while the priest blesses us and sends us on our way. Also at Mass, just before the reading of the Gospel, we trace a tiny sign of the cross on our foreheads, lips, and hearts praying through this sign that the word of God may always be in our minds, on our lips, and in our hearts. The Catholic faith is replete with signs of the cross; we encounter them in the conferring of the sacraments and in blessings, and they should always serve as reminders of Christ's sacrifice on the cross, suffered for our salvation.




