

Anointing Weekend

This weekend, the sacrament of the anointing of the sick will be offered after each of our regular Masses. Anyone who seeks healing in body, mind, or spirit is invited to come forward after Mass.

Dear Friends in Christ,

In today's gospel passage, Jesus tells a story that cuts to the heart of how we live and what we hold as values. A man asks Jesus to settle a family dispute over inheritance, but instead of intervening, Jesus warns the crowd: "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions."

He then tells the parable of a wealthy man who had a plentiful harvest. Rather than sharing or giving thanks, the man tears down his barns to build bigger ones—thinking he can finally relax and enjoy a life of ease. But God calls him a fool. That very night, his life ended. And all he had stored up? It all stays behind.

This parable isn't just about money—it's about the danger of placing our security in the wrong things. It's about the illusion that more is always better, and that possessions bring peace. Jesus challenges us to consider what it really means to be "rich in what matters to God." Are there things in our daily lives that we can do that show what it means to be "rich in what matters to God"?

As a parish family, let us remember: Our worth is not in what we have with us here on Earth, but in who we are in God's eyes. God has an image of every one of us and loves us all as his children. Our treasure is not stored in barns, but in the love we give, the faith we live, and the grace we share.

May we use this week to focus less on *storing* and more on *sharing*. Whether it's time, kindness, or a listening ear, these are the riches that truly last.



Did You Know?

Did you know that on August 6th the Church celebrates the Feast of the Transfiguration? All three synoptic gospels, Matthew, Mark and Luke, contain the story of Jesus being gloriously transfigured on a mountain and visible to Peter, James, and John, as he is also seen conversing with Moses and Elijah. Some scholars propose that since Peter suggested erecting three booths for Jesus, Moses, and Elijah, the incident occurred in early autumn during the Jewish Feast of Booths. Tradition tells us that the setting of the Transfiguration was Mount Tabor, and all three gospels place the occurrence shortly after Peter declared his belief in Jesus as the Messiah. The gospel story recounting the Transfiguration is read each year on the Second Sunday of Lent, following the First Sunday's reading of Christ's temptation in the desert, and together these two gospels emphasize Jesus' two natures – human, subject to temptation, and divine, sharing the glory of God the Father. Celebration of the Transfiguration goes as far back as the fourth century when a church was erected on the site, and in 1457 Pope Callistus III added the feast to the Church's calendar.


