

COME AND SEE OCIA BEGINS IN SEPTEMBER ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Whether you are an unbaptized person, someone baptized in another Christian tradition, or a baptized Catholic who did not grow up practicing the faith, the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is the place to learn more about Catholicism and to prepare for possible entry into the Church through the sacraments of initiation. OCIA will meet weekly at a time agreed upon by the participants. No commitment is required; people may elect to enter the Church when they are ready. One night this June, I received a text from my dad saying that he and my mom had decided to sell their sailboat. My mom's health was declining, and they saw no way to put the boat in the water this summer or in the future.

I couldn't believe it. Sell the boat?

Sailing has always been a central part of my family's life. There's never been a time we haven't had a sailboat either sitting in the backyard or bobbing on a mooring somewhere nearby. We've spent countless days out on the waves as a family, my dad at the tiller and my mom making sandwiches in the cabin.

When my siblings and I had our own children, my parents would take them for sails as well, helping another generation gain their sea legs and feel the pleasure of the sun and wind on their face while gliding along in perfect peace on the water.

Selling the boat would put an end to that chapter of my family's life. Even worse, it signaled to me that my parents were giving up on my mom ever getting better.

My first instinct was to reply to my dad's text with a message trying to convince him not to give up the boat and not to give up on the idea that we'd all be sailing together again soon.

Instead, I paused. And I asked God to guide me. Eventually, He led me to the message contained in today's second reading: "Let us...persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus" (Hebrews 12:1-4).

It's never been easy for me to focus on running my own race without getting caught up in what everyone else is doing. I've struggled with the concept as a back-of-the-pack runner, watching the faster and fitter runners leave me in their dust during a road race, and also when I see friends post pictures of their latest fancy vacation on social media.

But the hardest part of the race metaphor for me has always been allowing others to run THEIR own race.

In choosing to let go of their sailboat, my parents were acknowledging that their life's race had changed course. Instead of navigating harbors, they were preparing to navigate hospitals, possible treatments, and "next steps." I had to step out of the way and let them do what God was calling them to do.

Now I have to persevere in running whatever race God has set for me. While I know it involves supporting my parents as they face new challenges, I'm still finding my way. But if I can move forward while always "keeping my eyes fixed on Jesus," as today's reading says, I know God will point me in the right direction.

Did You Know?

Did you know *octaves* are used to celebrate the two central feasts of our faith? Based on historical records, as early as the 4th century the Church had discerned that the feasts of Christmas, Easter, and Pentecost were so sublime as to require more than one day for their observance and celebration. These feasts began to be observed over the course of eight days ("octave" meaning "eight") with the feast day counting as the first day. After the 4th century written references to octaves rapidly increased with the addition of octaves to most major feasts on the liturgical calendar, causing crowding, overlapping, and confusion. As the centuries passed, various popes found it necessary to begin eliminating octaves, leaving us today with only the octaves of Christmas and Easter. During these octaves, our liturgies focus and reflect on the spiritual implications of these supreme mysteries of our faith. Though we are left with only two octaves today, we can still find remnants of the historical importance of octaves within the liturgical calendar, as in August, where the Church chose in 1969 to place the celebration of the Queenship of Mary (Aug. 22nd) on the eighth day after the Feast of the Assumption (Aug. 15th).




