

St. Joseph Day

On March 19, Catholics around the world celebrate Saint Joseph's Day, also known as the Solemnity of Saint Joseph. It is also a feast or commemoration in the Anglican Communion and out his mission prayerfully, obediently, bravely, and joyfully. the Lutheran Church. For Poland, Canada, and those named Joseph or Josephine, it is a patronal feast day. In some Catholic countries, it doubles as Father's Day.

Even during Lent, Saint Joseph's Day stands out. The Gloria may be sung, vestments change from violet to white or gold, and joyful hymns fill the air. It is a rare moment of celebration within the Lenten season.

Saint Joseph, often depicted with a carpenter's square or tools, holds a revered place in Christianity. His life, though veiled in silence, carries profound significance. He was a remarkable man—the earthly father of Jesus and the spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

As a carpenter, Joseph worked with his hands—shaping wood, constructing homes, and laboring in obscurity. His trade symbolizes both practicality and craftsmanship. In this humble vocation, he found purpose and provided for his family. Joseph, a 1st-century Jewish man from Nazareth, emerges from the shadows of the New Testament. Both the Gospels of Matthew and Luke introduce him as Mary's husband and Jesus' legal father. When faced with Mary's miraculous pregnancy, he chose obedience over doubt, exemplifying selflessness in his unwavering commitment to protect Mary and Jesus. His obedience echoes the trust that God places in his role transcends mere lineage; he becomes the guardian of the Holy Family.

When Herod's wrath threatens the infant Jesus, Joseph leads his family into Egypt—a journey of refuge and sacrifice. His commitment to their safety exemplifies selflessness. He becomes the protector of the Word made flesh.

Joseph's purity extends beyond physical fidelity. His heart remains untainted—a vessel for God's plan. His chaste love for Mary and Jesus mirrors the divine love that envelops humanity.

Joseph is the patron saint of workers. His hands, once calloused from carpentry, now guide us in our daily toil. He embodies dignity in labor, reminding us that work sanctifies.

Although Joseph's death remains unrecorded in the Gospels, tradition holds that he passed away in the presence of Jesus and Mary—a holy death.

Saint Joseph, the master of the interior life, is the "Chaste Guardian of the Virgin." His purity, poverty, and exemplary fatherhood terrify Satan. God singled him out to protect His most precious treasures—Jesus and Mary. The brave saint carried

St. Joseph

Church Location: Right Wall, Window #1, Right Image

Lived: First Century

Feast Day: March 19,(Solemnity - an extra special Feast!) **Bio:** While we do not know much about Joseph's life, we do know the most important thing, his secret to holiness: Joseph always did what God wanted him to do. Sometimes he had to struggle to discern God's will, but when he received divine guidance, he acted promptly. Joseph loved his family and provided for Jesus and Mary through his hard work. His silence helps us to realize the profound interior life he lived. The Gospels do not record any words of Joseph - but they do record his

deeds. In this way he testified to what Jesus taught us: "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord', will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does wil of my Father in heaven" (Mt 7:21).

Image: In our stained glass window, Joseph can be seen holding white lilies in his right hand and a carpenter's square in his left, two very common symbols for Joseph in Catholic art. The white lilies symbolize the purity and virtue of St. Joseph and his wife Mary. Joseph was a hardworking carpenter "Is he [Jesus] not the carpenter's son?" (Mt 13:55), a craft he taught Jesus.

Reflection: Joseph, along with Mary, drew others to Jesus, rather than drawing attention to himself. This is the most important of the virtues, the virtue of humility. Humility is not thinking less of yourself. Rather, it is thinking of yourself, less. How can I live in such a way that I draw attention to Jesus?

SAINT PATRICK

5th Century: Patron Saint of Ireland Born in Britain but kidnapped at the age of 16, Saint Patrick was then sold into slavery in Ireland, where he spent six years as a shepherd until he was able to escape and flee back to Britain. A faithful Christian, Saint Patrick returned to Ireland years after his escape,

where he became a bishop and dedicated his life to the spread of Christianity, baptizing and confirming multitudes of people there and beyond. He died in Saul, at the site of his first church, after an angel told him to return there, despite his wanting to die in Ireland. His feast day is March 17th. 1st Century: Patron Saint of the Universal Roman Catholic Church

Saint Joseph was born and raised in Nazareth, in Galilee, where he worked as a carpenter. He met and married the Blessed Virgin Mary, and after a vision from an angel who told him the baby Mary carried in her womb was the Son of God, Saint Joseph agreed to raise Jesus as his own son and trained Him to also be a carpenter. Not much is known about Saint Joseph's life and even less about his death, although it is widely believed that

he died years before Jesus' Crucifixion., and possibly even before Jesus started his ministry. His feast day is March 19th. For more on Saint Joseph,






