February 2: The Presentation of the Lord

“When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph took Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord, ‘Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord,’ and to offer the sacrifice of ‘a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons,’ in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord” (Luke 2:22–24).

Each year on February 2, forty days after Christmas, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This feast draws the joy of the Nativity into conversation with the sorrowful mystery of the Cross. Rich in symbolism and rooted in ancient tradition, it is also known as Candlemas. In a culture already moving past the Christmas season, the Feast of the Presentation can easily go unnoticed. Yet, like so much in the Church’s liturgical life, its meaning deepens when we pause and reflect.

The feast recalls Mary and Joseph bringing the infant Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem in obedience to the Law of Moses. That law required that every firstborn male be consecrated to the Lord and that a sacrifice be offered for the purification of the mother. Mary, though conceived without sin, and Jesus, the eternal Son of God, freely submit to this law. What appears to be a simple religious duty becomes a moment of profound revelation. In the Temple, Jesus is recognized not only as the Messiah of Israel, but as the Savior of the world. At the same time, Simeon speaks words that carry sorrow. He tells Mary that a sword will pierce her heart, so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed.

The celebration of this feast reaches back to the fourth century. By the middle of the fifth century, it was known as the Feast of the Meeting of the Lord. This name highlights the encounter between Christ and the faithful people of Israel, represented by Simeon and Anna. In them, the long waiting of God’s people comes to fulfillment. Over time, the blessing and procession of candles became an essential part of the celebration. This practice was inspired by Simeon’s hymn of praise: “My eyes have seen your salvation... a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel.”

Candles add more than beauty and reverence to the feast. They are visible signs of a deeper spiritual truth. They proclaim

that darkness cannot overcome the light of Christ. On Candlemas, the Church traditionally blessed candles to be used throughout the year. These candles reminded the faithful that Christ remains present with his people in every season of life. Candlelit processions on this feast were introduced in Jerusalem and later in Rome as early as the fifth century. These processions reinforced the feast’s central message: Christ, the Light of the world, has entered his Temple.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church expresses this mystery clearly: “The presentation of Jesus in the temple shows him to be the firstborn Son who belongs to the Lord. With Simeon and Anna, all Israel awaits its encounter with the Savior... Jesus is recognized as the long-expected Messiah, the ‘light to the nations’ and the ‘glory of Israel,’ but also ‘a sign that is spoken against.’ The sword of sorrow predicted for Mary announces Christ’s perfect and unique oblation on the cross” (CCC 529). From the very beginning of his earthly life, the shadow of the Cross falls across both Christ and his Mother.”

The feast of the Presentation reminds us that often, faith is lived through steady obedience. Mary and Joseph’s journey to the Temple was outwardly ordinary, yet inwardly transformative. Their faithfulness teaches us that holiness often grows through quiet acts of trust. Even when God’s purposes are not fully clear, we are invited to be faithful, to show up, and to offer what we have.

In 1997, Pope Saint John Paul II gave added meaning to this feast by establishing the World Day for Consecrated Life on February 2. Consecrated men and women reflect the light of Christ through lives dedicated to prayer, service, and sacrifice. Their witness reminds the Church and the wider world that Christ remains present, active, and radiant through those who give their lives completely to him.

This week, place yourselves alongside Mary and Joseph in the Temple. We are called to present our own lives to God—our hopes, our fears, and our obedience—and to trust that Christ, the true Light, will sanctify them.

Almighty and ever-living God, as your Only-begotten Son was presented in the Temple this day, may we also be presented to you with pure and clean hearts, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.


JANUARY BAPTISMS WALPOLE CATHOLIC COLLABORATIVE
