From the Desk of Rev. Heniston Washington, Parochial Vicar

The Season of Lent

“Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.” Mt. 4:17

Life in the modern world is busy. We travel across cities, countries, and continents for work, study, or to visit loved ones. Yet among all these journeys, the most important one—the **journey within ourselves**—is often neglected. Lent is the sacred time the Church gives us to make this inward pilgrimage.

Jesus warns us of the danger of noticing the faults of others while ignoring our own: **“Why do you notice the splinter in your brother’s eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own eye?”** (Mt 7:3–4). Honest self-examination reveals both our strengths and our weaknesses. This requires courage and humility and challenges our natural tendency to avoid looking inward.

Throughout Scripture, we encounter God who does not desire the destruction of sinners but their conversion. Conversion is not a single moment but a lifelong effort of turning more fully toward God and His grace. As Pope Benedict XVI teaches, true conversion has two inseparable dimensions: recognizing our faults and repenting of them. This means acknowledging our sins, surrendering ourselves to God, and welcoming His grace, so that this Lenten season may become fruitful and transformative.

Our Lenten practices—prayer, fasting, almsgiving, and even pilgrimages—are not ends in themselves. Their purpose is to orient our hearts toward genuine change. They must be undertaken not with the spirit of the Pharisees but with sincerity and humility. We might ask ourselves: *What is my spiritual goal for this Lent?* Once we name that goal, our practices become like a spiritual GPS guiding us toward God.

A beautiful example of repentance is Zacchaeus (Lk 19:1–10). His encounter with Jesus did not leave him unchanged; he not only felt sorrow for his sins but also renewed his relationship with God and with his neighbors. This is the heart of true repentance.

As we begin this sacred season, let us embrace conversion with sincerity. As parents, elders, and leaders in our families and parish, may we also pass on the deeper meaning of Lent to our children and young people. If we surrender ourselves to God’s grace, Lent will become a time of lasting joy, spiritual growth, and renewed relationships.

Pastoral Lenten Suggestions

As we enter this holy season, consider choosing one simple practice that helps you turn your heart more fully toward God and to have a good and genuine relationship with others. Even a small, humble step—offered with sincerity—opens the soul to grace.

You might consider:

- **Reading the life of a saint**, allowing their journey of conversion to inspire your own.
- **Making a daily Examination of the Heart**—spend five quiet minutes each evening asking where you encountered God and where you resisted His grace.
- **Healing one relationship** by praying daily for that person or taking a small step toward reconciliation.
- **Performing a hidden act of charity** each week for someone without seeking recognition.
- **Simplifying one area of your life** as a form of fasting (e.g., reducing screen time, avoiding negative speech, slowing down).
- **Visiting the Blessed Sacrament** every day spend quality time in the Lord’s presence.
- **Praying with the Sunday Gospel** for 10 minutes, asking Jesus what He wants to speak into your life.
- **Including your family** in simple Lenten practices—lighting a candle for evening prayer, choosing a shared sacrifice, or supporting a charity together.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL END OF THE YEAR REPORT

Last year, thanks to the generosity of our parishioners and private donors, we were able to provide more than \$94,000 in temporary financial assistance to our neighbors. Most of this support helped with housing, utilities, and heat, with over 88% staying right here in Walpole.

Our volunteers also completed 97 home visits, including 18 visits with individuals experiencing homelessness, and supported more than 100 children. We are currently a group of 13 volunteers and 2 associate members and are always happy to welcome new members.

PINE STREET INN COLLECTION


Thanks to all who donated to our last collection. It was the largest donation we have ever received- 1358 items. We are so inspired by your generosity in these challenging times.


STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The Stations of the Cross, also known as the Way of the Cross or Via Crucis, commemorate Jesus's passion and death on the cross. There are 14 stations that each depict a moment on his journey to Calvary, usually through sacred art, prayers, and reflections. The practice began as pious pilgrims traced his path through Jerusalem on the Via Dolorosa.

FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT

READING 1.....GENESIS 2:7-9; 3:1-7

The LORD God formed man out of the clay of the ground and blew into his nostrils the breath of life, and so man became a living being. Then the LORD God planted a garden in Eden, in the east, and placed there the man whom he had formed. Out of the ground the LORD God made various trees grow that were delightful to look at and good for food, with the tree of life in the middle of the garden and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. Now the serpent was the most cunning of all the animals that the LORD God had made.

The serpent asked the woman, "Did God really tell you not to eat from any of the trees in the garden?"

The woman answered the serpent: "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; it is only about the fruit of the tree in the middle of the garden that God said, 'You shall not eat it or even touch it, lest you die.'"

But the serpent said to the woman: "You certainly will not die! No, God knows well that the moment you eat of it your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods who know what is good and what is evil."

The woman saw that the tree was good for food, pleasing to the eyes, and desirable for gaining wisdom. So she took some of its fruit and ate it; and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it.

Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they realized that they were naked; so they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves.

Brothers and sisters:

Through one man sin entered the world, and through sin, death, and thus death came to all men, inasmuch as all sinned.

For if, by the transgression of the one, death came to reign through that one, how much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and of the gift of justification come to reign in life through the one Jesus Christ.

In conclusion, just as through one transgression condemnation came upon all, so, through one righteous act, acquittal and life came to all. For just as through the disobedience of the one man the many were made sinners, so, through the obedience of the one, the many will be made righteous.

VERSE BEFORE THE GOSPEL

One does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God.

GOSPEL.....MATTHEW 4:1-11

At that time Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was hungry. The tempter approached and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command that these stones become loaves of bread."

He said in reply, "It is written:

One does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God."

Then the devil took him to the holy city, and made him stand on the parapet of the temple, and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down.

For it is written: *He will command his angels concerning you and with their hands they will support you, lest you dash your foot against a stone.*"

Jesus answered him, "Again it is written, *You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test.*"

Then the devil took him up to a very high mountain, and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in their magnificence and he said to him, "All these I shall give to you, if you will prostrate yourself and worship me."






